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CAYETANO: PH CANNOT BE A 'ONE-ISSUE NATION' AMID IMPEACHMENT TRIAL
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TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite – To better serve its population of over 4.3 million, the Provincial Government of Cavite is further strengthening its public health services through modernized healthcare facilities and enhanced support for healthcare workers. Following his inspection of local health facilities last May, Governor Francisco Gabriel Remulla announced that the Provincial Government has allotted a total of Php 500 million to upgrade the General Emilio Aguinaldo Hospital (GEAMH) and the Cavite Center for Mental Health. In a statement, Remulla said the provincial government will allot Php 300 million to GEAMH and the remaining Php 200 million to the Cavite Center for Mental Health. The funds will cover the rehabilitation and improvement of hospital infrastructure as well

DA-ATI LAUNCHES CAPACITY BUILDING FOR CFIDP BENEFICIARIES IN MAGALLANES
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IMPEACHMENT IS A CONSTITUTIONAL PROCESS, NOT A POLITICAL SPECTACLE

The impeachment proceedings involving the Vice President have once again placed the nation's political institutions under the public spotlight. While the issue has generated intense debate among supporters and critics alike, it is important to remember that impeachment is not merely a political contest—it is a constitutional mechanism designed to uphold accountability among the country's highest public officials.

The Philippine Constitution provides impeachment as a means of addressing allegations of serious misconduct committed by officials entrusted with the public's confidence. It is neither a declaration of guilt nor a guarantee of innocence. Rather, it is a legal and constitutional process that allows evidence to be presented, examined, and weighed before a final judgment is made.

As the Senate convenes as an impeachment court, its members carry a responsibility that extends beyond political

affiliations or personal convictions. Their duty is to uphold the Constitution, evaluate the facts impartially, and ensure that justice is served based on evidence and the rule of law. The credibility of the institution depends on its ability to conduct the proceedings with fairness, transparency, and independence.

Likewise, those presenting the case and those defending the Vice President must allow the process to unfold without resorting to misinformation, personal attacks, or attempts to influence public opinion through political rhetoric. In a democracy, due process remains the cornerstone of justice.

The Filipino people also have a role to play. Public interest in the proceedings is both understandable and necessary, but opinions should be grounded in verified information rather than speculation or partisan narratives. Democracy is strengthened when citizens remain informed, discerning, and respectful of constitutional institutions.

SERVING HOPE ONE SCOOP AT A TIME



Sherilyn and Mario Donque stand proudly beside their humble ice cream cart, a business that provides for their daily needs.

Ice cream is one of the most popular desserts in Filipino households. For many, it is more than just a sweet treat; it is their comfort food, often enjoyed as a refreshing way to unwind, especially on hot summer days.

One of the ice cream sellers in Valencia, Bukidnon, is the couple, Sherilyn and Mario Donque. Since getting married in 2005, the ice cream business has been their main source of income. Through years of hard work, their business has also helped them build a resilient life.

Crossing paths

Sherilyn was a high school graduate when she decided to leave home and work in Cebu. She spent a year working as a housekeeper before a close friend invited her to visit Bukidnon for a vacation. During her trip, she met the man who later became her husband, Mario Donque. Their relationship eventually blossomed, and soon enough, they got married and began building a life together.

Even before they met, Mario was running his humble ice cream business, using the skills he had learned from a relative. Through their shared effort, the business became the family's foundation and main source of financial support.

Mario started selling ice cream at around 9:00 AM and usually came home at 6:00 PM. When he returned, they would prepare another batch of ice cream for the following day. This has become their daily routine. Through daily hard work and teamwork, they sustain their livelihood and provide for their families.

While Mario is out selling ice cream, Sherilyn manages the household and prepares ingredients for their products.

As with any business, there were times when their sales would slow, especially during the rainy season. However, despite these, they understood that business was never constant. The good days and slow days are part of the journey, so they just kept moving forward.

“Para sa akin, importante talaga na may negosyo kasi magagamit mo yung income sa iba't ibang pangangailangan ng pamilya mo. (For me, business is really important because your income becomes

something you can depend on when needs come up), Sherilyn stated.

To gain additional capital for their business, Sherilyn became a client of CARD, Inc. (A Microfinance NGO) in 2019. Since then, she has been able to access financial assistance whenever their funds fall short for production needs.

Currently, she uses her PHP 50,000.00 loan from the institution to purchase raw ingredients for their ice cream business. Aside from buying ingredients, her previous loans from CARD, Inc. were also used to renovate their house.

In the coming years, the couple hopes their business will continue to grow. Although they do not expect rapid expansion, they are happy to see it steadily and consistently grow over time.

BACoor STRENGTHENS DISASTER PREPAREDNESS THROUGH EMERGENCY RISK ASSESSMENT MEETING



BACoor CITY, Cavite — The City Government of Bacoor, through the Bacoor Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (BDRRMO), convened an Emergency Meeting on Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment and Guidance on July 6 at the Strike Multi-Purpose Hall to strengthen the city's preparedness for possible weather disturbances and other emergencies.

The meeting was led by BDRRMO Head Richard Quion and attended by Mayor Strike B. Revilla, Vice Mayor Rowena B. Mendiola, Councilor Noly Galvez, Board Member Rafael Paterno III, Liga ng mga Barangay President Randy Francisco, department and unit heads, and representatives from the Philippine National Police (PNP), Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), Department of Education (DepEd), and the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG).

Discussions centered on the latest weather updates from PAGASA, including typhoon forecasts, projected rainfall, wind conditions, and hazard assessments for flood-prone and coastal communities. Officials also reviewed the city's disaster response plans, evacuation site readiness, availability of food and medical supplies, rescue equipment, transportation resources, and operational protocols for various emergency scenarios.

The meeting also covered post-disaster recovery strategies aimed at ensuring the immediate restoration of essential public services and the timely delivery of assistance to affected residents once weather conditions improve.

Mayor Revilla underscored the importance of proactive planning and inter-agency coordination, stressing that early preparedness remains the most effective way to minimize risks, protect lives, and safeguard property during calamities. Meanwhile, Quion assured that the BDRRMO and partner agencies continue to maintain close coordination to ensure a swift and organized response should severe weather conditions affect the city.

The City Government of Bacoor reaffirmed its commitment to disaster resilience by continuously enhancing preparedness measures and strengthening cooperation among government agencies and community stakeholders to ensure the safety and well-being of every Bacooreño.

INDANG OPENS SUPER HEALTH CENTER TO EXPAND HEALTHCARE SERVICES



INDANG, Cavite — The Municipal Government of Indang officially inaugurated the Indang Super Health Center on July 2 through a blessing and ribbon-cutting ceremony led by Mayor Virgilio Fidel, marking another milestone in the municipality's efforts to improve public healthcare services.

NEWBORN SCREENING CARAVAN PROMOTES EARLY DETECTION IN CAVITE



TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite — The Office of the Provincial Health Officer (OPHO), in partnership with the Department of Health–Center for Health Development (DOH-CHD) CALABARZON and the Trece Martires City Health Office, successfully conducted a Newborn Screening Caravan on June 24 at the General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital (GEAMH) and SM City Trece Martires.

The caravan aimed to raise awareness among parents, caregivers, and healthcare workers about the importance of newborn screening in detecting congenital disorders at an early stage. Health experts emphasized that timely diagnosis and intervention can prevent serious health complications, intellectual disabilities, and even death among affected infants.

One of the highlights of the activity was a lecture on the Newborn Screening Continuity Clinic, which underscored the importance of confirmatory testing, continuous monitoring, medical management, and long-term follow-up for newborns with positive screening results. Participants also learned about the vital role of continuity clinics in ensuring that infants with metabolic and inherited disorders receive appropriate care throughout their development.

Healthcare professionals from the DOH-CHD CALABARZON, OPHO, and Trece Martires City Health Office also facilitated newborn screening specimen collection and other related health services, making these essential services more accessible to families across Cavite.

The activity was attended by Trece Martires City Mayor Gemma Lubigan and Vice Mayor Bobby Montehermoso, who expressed their support for programs promoting maternal and child health. The caravan also complemented the free newborn screening initiative conducted in partnership with the GMA Kapuso Foundation, prioritizing newborns from Trece Martires City, General Trias City, and Tanza while remaining open to eligible infants from other parts of Cavite.

Officials said the initiative forms part of the Department of Health's continuing efforts to strengthen the National Newborn Screening Program and reflects the Provincial Government of Cavite's commitment to ensuring that every newborn receives quality healthcare and the best possible start in life.

NAIC, Cavite — The Local Health Insurance Office (LHIO) Trece Martires City joined the celebration of Naic Migrant Workers Day on June 19 at the Daluyan Community Resource Center in Barangay Malainen Bago, reaffirming its commitment to bringing essential healthcare information and services closer to overseas Filipino workers (OFWs) and their families.

Senate Minority Leader Alan Peter Cayetano on Monday warned against making the impeachment trial of Vice President Sara Duterte the country's sole focus, saying urgent issues such as flood control corruption, the economy, and disaster response must also be addressed.

In a Facebook livestream before the July 6 proceedings, Cayetano said the impeachment trial should proceed in an orderly and impartial manner but that other urgent issues must not be sidelined.

“Yung imbestigasyon sa flood control, sa mga pang-aapi sa ating mga kababayan, pwedeng ituloy-tuloy po lahat ‘yan. We cannot stop. Hindi y’ung one-issue nation tayo,” he said.

He asked why the Senate can fix a 30-week working schedule for the impeachment trial but cannot schedule Senate Blue Ribbon Committee hearings on the unresolved billion-peso flood control controversy.

“Ulitin ko po: tama y’ung isaayos natin ang impeachment [schedule]. Tama na nagkaroon ng pre-trial. Tama na lahat tayo maging impartial. Bakit, hindi ba tayo pwedeng maging impartial din sa flood control? At napakarami pang ibang corruption issues,” he said.

He emphasized that the Senate can proceed with the impeachment trial while continuing investigations into flood control, Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) projects, corruption, and other alleged abuses.

“Pwede naman po nating isabay na magkaroon ng imbestigasyon sa flood control, sa iba pang DPWH projects, sa iba pang corruption sa ating bansa, maging among ahensya man ‘yan,” he said.

Cayetano likewise warned of a “creeping economic crisis” while the Senate focuses on the

impeachment trial, citing small businesses that are struggling with weaker earnings and higher costs.

“Maraming small businesses ngayon, 20-30 percent ang niliiit ng kita, in danger na masara. Tumaas nga sweldo [sa NCR], nagsara naman [ang mga negosyo],” he said.

Last week, an P85 increase in the minimum wage in Metro Manila was approved, but businesses are also operating under a weaker economy, high prices, and softer consumer demand. Inflation remained above target at 6.8 percent in May, while household consumption growth slowed to 3.3 percent and investment growth weakened to 3.3 percent.

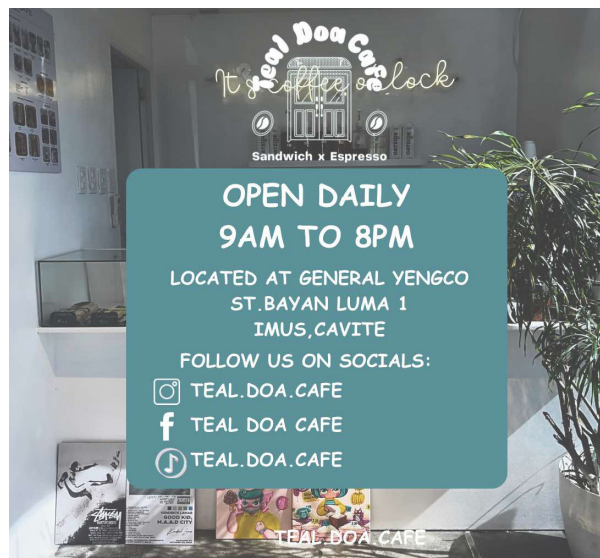
“Dahil ang focus ng gobyerno ay nasa impeachment at wala d’un sa anti-flood control corruption, wala d’un sa ekonomiya, mukhang creeping na palaki itong economic crisis na huwag naman sana,” he warned.

Cayetano added that the government must also stay alert to disaster risks, including storms, the super El Niño, and volcanic activity.

The state weather bureau has warned that a severe El Niño could persist until 2027, which could result in severe drought and flooding. The Department of Agriculture also said it could reduce rice production by as much as 700,000 metric tons.

Against these simultaneous pressures, Cayetano appealed to the public to remain focused not just on the impeachment trial but also on the broader fight to protect the Constitution, uphold truth, and expose corruption.

“Ipaglaban natin ang Constitution ng ating bansa. Ipaglaban po natin ang katotohanan. Let’s not fight each other – let’s fight corruption,” he said.##
