## BJMP TO REV UP FIGHT AGAINST JAIL **CONTRABANDS**



CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) -- The Bureau of Jail Management and Penology (BJMP) on Tuesday warned people visiting persons deprived of liberty (PDLs) detained in BJMP-administered detention facilities not to attempt to sneak in contraband such as weapons and illegal drugs or they risk getting prosecuted.

"[BJMP] will not tolerate such actions, and we will continue to instill in the persons deprived of liberty and their visitors the gravity of our commitment to implementing programs aimed at preventing the proliferation of contrabands and the devastating effects of smuggling within our jail facilities." said Jail Chief Inspector Hilbert Flor, Regional Director of BJMP.

Flor made the statement after jail personnel together with personnel from the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency, Philippine National Police, Bureau of Fire Protection and other allied security personnel conducted Greyhound operations in the regional jail facility.

The director also said that they have enacted stricter guidelines for families and other visitors of PDLs to ensure that contrabands are not being illegally brought inside correctional facilities. "We strictly implement searches as soon as our visitors enter the gate. We have searchers there, and we rigorously look into their belongings, food, and inspect the clothes of our visitors. There are cases where they also use their children as instruments to conceal illegal contrabands in their clothes or on the bodies of small children. All of these are being studied and examined by our jail personnel," Flor said.

Through Grevhound Operations, BJMP IV-A has confiscated 137 mobile phones, 100 sim cards, two memory cards, over 310 packs of cigarettes from 2019 to 2022. The said items were destroyed in a ceremony on October 24 at the BJMP IV-A Regional Office in Calamba City, Laguna, as part of the bureau's celebration of National Correctional Consciousness Week (NA-COCOW)

Once confiscated, items are being analyzed and assessed if these can be used as an additional criminal charge for an inmate.

According to BJMP, PDLs caught in possession of prohibited items is a grave offense and will face sanctions imposed by its Disciplinary Board, such as temporary cancellation of all or some recreational privileges, suspension of visitation privileges, close confinement and monitoring, and/or transfer to another BJMP facility in coordination with the Court.

JCINSP Flor then gives a stern warning to PDLs and their families to yield the smuggling of items as they may be charged as accomplices and may face charges or hefty fines.





We don't want that to happen, but if it happens, then our Defense Treaty Mutual with the United States will come into play," he added. 'We should not be avoid ing the Chinese there. They should be the ones avoiding us in our territory. 



MANILA, Philippines — The Philippine Coast Guard on Saturday said it detected the largest number of Chinese ships to swarm the vicinity of Ayungin shoal — 38 in total — during its latest resupply mission to the BRP Sierra Madre.

Of the 38 ships, most or 28 were Chinese militia vessels, while there were five China Coast Guard (CCG) vessels and five People's Liberation Army vessels, PCG Spokesperson Jav Tarriela said during a media briefing





## Gov't unveils cash, rice aid program for the poor in Laguna



BIÑAN CITY, Laguna (PIA) -- Over 5,000 poor residents in two cities in Laguna were given cash and rice support from the government as it launched on Sunday a new assistance program for vulnerable

The program, dubbed as Cash Assistance and Rice Distribution (CARD), was simultaneously unveiled in the National Capital Region (NCR), covering 33 legislative districts in 17 cities, courtesy of the Office of the President, House of Representatives and the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD).

Speaker Ferdinand Martin Romualdez led the dis-

tribution in the cities of Biñan and Sta. Rosa where recipients that included senior citizens, persons with disabilities (PWDs), single parents, and indigenous peoples were each given 25-kilogram rice and P4,000 cash assistance.

Romualdez said the initiative aligns with President Ferdinand Marcos Jr.'s vision of providing affordable and high-quality rice to vulnerable communities

"This program was developed in response to the challenge set by President Marcos Jr. to Congress to find ways to provide our communities with affordable and high-quality rice," he said.



Local legislators and other officials showed their support for the launch of the Cash Assistance and Rice Distribution (CARD) Program spearheaded by President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr., Speaker Ferdinand Martin Romualdez, House of Representatives, and the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD).

The Speaker emphasized that the target is to reach 10,000 beneficiaries per district. In addition to rice and cash assistance, the Speaker distributed various prizes, including new motorcycle units, educational kits, and grocery packs to the beneficiaries.

Santa Rosa City Vice Mayor Arnold Arcillas expressed hope that the cash assistance would be used by the beneficiaries to enhance their livelihood.

He said: "The cash and rice subsidy given to our constituents can somehow help. The cash can be used as seed money if they want to start a business, and the rice is sufficient for their needs."

Santa Rosa resident Joana Ferrer expressed gratitude for winning a motorcycle unit and receiving a rice pack. She plans to convert the motorcycle into a tricycle, which her husband can use for transportation.

"Thank you so much because I never expected to win, not even in my dreams. To everyone involved in the Bagong Pilipinas, this is a tremendous help for us, the less fortunate." she added.

Local legislators, including representatives Len Alonte -Naguiat of Biñan City and Dan Fernandez of Santa Rosa City, Governor Ramil Hernandez, Laguna 2nd District Rep. Ruth Mariano-Hernandez, DSWD Region IV-A Regional Director Barry Chua, and other officials showed their support for the program.

"This is just the beginning of continuously providing relief to our citizens. Rest assured that the Office of the Speaker and the entire House of Representatives, together with President Marcos, are always here to ensure that there is sufficient funding for programs dedicated to ordinary Filipinos," Romualdez said.
