Caingin in Santa Rosa, and Brgy. Maliksi 1 in Bacoor. Aside from the efforts exerted in the said coastal barangays, MPT South also donated cleaning materials such as safety boots, sacks, brooms, gloves, and garbage pickers for the cleaning of the Las Piñas - Parañaque Wetland Park (LPPWP). LPPWP is a critical protected area managed by DENR to preserve its rich biodiversity and ecological value, a Ramsar site situated in the Gulf of Manila.

MPT South volunteer employees assisted in collecting 65 kg of residual waste and 48 kg of other debris in the coastline of Santa Rosa, accumulating to 12,039 kilograms of waste removed from its coast; on the other hand, a total of 43.5 kg of wood debris and 60.5 kg of plastic and foam materials were collected by MPT South volunteers

in the coast of Bacoor, resulting in a total of 7,275 kilograms of waste collected from the coastal area. Efforts like these continue to pave the way in raising awareness about marine conservation, proper waste segregation, and promoting sustainable practices among its volunteers.

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Cavite Career Caravan Brings Employment Opportunities to Noveleta Residents



NOVELETA, Cavite — Job seekers in Noveleta were given new employment opportunities as the Office of the Provincial Public Employment Service Manager (OPPESM), headed by Ms. Rizalie Pinpin Enero, in partnership with the Municipal Government of Noveleta led by Mayor Davey Reyes Chua, successfully held the Cavite Career Caravan on October 3 at the Noveleta Town Plaza.

The event gathered 35 local companies and four international employers, offering a wide range of career options for 176 registered job-seekers, with 23 applicants hired on the spot.

Several national government agencies also joined the caravan, including the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA), Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR), Social Security System (SSS), Pag-IBIG Fund, and Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), to assist applicants and residents in updating their records. The Bank of the Philippine Islands (BPI) likewise participated by offering additional employment opportunities.

Demonstrating his commitment to transparency and community engagement, Mayor Chua went live on Facebook during the event to provide real-time updates, ensuring residents were well-informed and encouraged to participate.

Mayor Chua expressed his gratitude to Governor Juanito Victor “Jonvic” Remulla, OPPESM, and all partner agencies and organizations for their collaborative efforts in making the event a success. 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BACOOR, MERALCO FOUNDATION EXTEND AID TO CIUDAD DE STRIKE RESIDENTS; COMMUNITY LAUNCHES KURYENTE TIPID LOAD PROGRAM

Senate Minority Leader Alan Peter Cayetano on Wednesday explained his vote in favor of Senate Resolution No. 144, which expressed the sense of the Senate in requesting the International Criminal Court (ICC) to place former President Rodrigo Duterte under house arrest for humanitarian considerations.

The resolution, adopted on October 1, passed with 15 senators voting yes, three voting no, and two abstaining. Cayetano, one of the original authors of a similar measure filed earlier, said his support was rooted in the principles of justice and hu-

manitarian treatment.

“Iba ang vengeance sa justice. Ang vengeance is an emotional impulse of someone who is a victim of injustice. In Tagalog, gusto niyang gantihan. Ang justice, hustisya, ay well-defined sa international community and I know that as a former Secretary of Foreign Affairs,” Cayetano said.

He stressed that the measure is not about reopening debates on the drug war but about ensuring fairness for all parties concerned, consistent with human rights conventions signed by the Philippines.

According to Cayetano, humanitarian treatment and due process are central to justice, which must remain impartial.

“Ang hustisya po ay bulag. Nakatakip po yung mata para nga walang makita [at maging patas,]” he said.

Cayetano also clarified that while debates on the drug war may continue, the resolution focuses on respecting justice and upholding international standards.

“I vote yes Mr. President and I thank our colleagues for putting this on the floor,” he said. /PR

The ceremony also spotlighted innovation and social responsibility through the Excellence Awards.

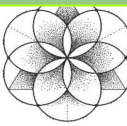
The City of General Trias was cited for Best Practices in Sustainable Tourism Management.

**Indang Strengthens Barangay
Anti-Drug Efforts Through ADAC
Summit 2025**



Tagaytay City, October 6, 2025 — In support of the national government’s intensified campaign against illegal drugs and the goal of building drug-resistant communities, the Municipality of Indang successfully held the Indang Anti-Drug Abuse Council (ADAC) Summit 2025 at Hotel Casiana, Tagaytay City.

The summit featured the Program Orientation on Strengthening Institutional Capacities of the Barangay Anti-Drug Abuse Council (SI-

CAP-BADAC) and Adbokasiya LABan sa Ilegal na Droga (ALAB), which brought together 216 participants composed of BADAC Chairpersons, Advocacy and Operations Chairs, Sangguniang Kabataan officials, Barangay Secretaries, and Chief Tanods from Indang’s 36 barangays.

The orientation aimed to enhance the capability of barangay leaders to develop, implement, and sustain effective anti-drug programs at the grassroots level.

Key discussion topics included the SICAP-BAD-AC Module, which covered standardized BADAC guidelines, organizational structures, performance assessment tools, and the sustainability of the Barangay Drug Clearing Program. Other topics focused on the National Anti-Drug Strategy, DILG Memorandum Circular 2018-01, and Republic Act 9165, the Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002.

The ALAB session introduced participants to community-based advocacy frameworks, engagement strategies, and successful anti-drug campaigns, along with insights into the Drug-Free Workplace Program and Drug Abuse Prevention Education initiatives.

Representatives from key agencies such as the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), Philippine National Police (PNP), and the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) were also present to provide technical guidance and support.

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Steamed with Love

To preserve the siopao business her husband has started, Teodorica Cabaless from Calapan City dedicated herself to perfecting a recipe that would win the hearts of many customers.

Originally from San Teodoro, Teodorica later settled in Calapan City with her family. Life was not easy early on. After finishing elementary school, she began working as a household helper for relatives. As she grew older, she continued working as a helper for different families. At 16, she chose to live with her partner, longing for someone she could depend on.

Her husband was a meat butcher, while she became a meat vendor at a local market. The couple spent many years working side by side in the market. Then in 1989, her husband decided to venture into the siopao business.

The story behind the business

Teodorica's husband often delivered meat to a siopao store, which sparked his interest in starting a similar business. Encouraged by the idea, he decided to give it a try.

However, just a year later, and for some reason, he decided to drop the venture, which pushed Teodorica to take over. With no prior knowledge of siopao making, the process initially proved difficult for her, but she persevered tirelessly until she developed a siopao recipe she was proud of.

To promote her product, she personally went from place to place, selling at stalls, schools, and neighborhoods. What began with a simple cart eventually evolved into a mobile food cart mounted on a tricycle in 2018.

With the help of her children, they can produce around 300 pieces of siopao each day. One of her children helps her make the siopao, while the other takes charge of selling it. Their production starts at 10:00 am and ends at 2:00 pm, and they sell it from 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm.

Even her other children, now living in Batangas and Laguna, have followed their footsteps and started their own siopao business, carrying on the family legacy.

For over three decades, Teodorica's business has stood the test of time. Through all the years, she has remained committed to maintaining the same quality and taste that keeps customers coming back.

Whenever she falls short on capital, she turns to CARD Bank, a microfinance-oriented rural bank. She became a client in 2007 and has since relied on the institution for business loans to support her siopao business. Currently, she has a loan of PHP 150,000.00, which she uses to purchase raw materials, especially now that prices are continuously increasing.

Teodorica offers her siopao at affordable prices, ranging from PHP 15.00 to PHP 30.00, ensuring that everyone can enjoy and experience the taste of her product.

"For the future of my business, my biggest hope is to have my own store. I am working hard every day, together with my children, to make that dream come true," she concluded. /PR

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite (PIA) – Farmers in the CALABARZON region will soon adopt modern technology to revolutionize local agricultural practices and improve local rice production.

Last September 15 to 19, around 25 rice farmers from the provinces of Batangas and Cavite joined DA ATI's training on Integrated Nutrient and Water Management (INWM).

Launched by the Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Training Institute (DA ATI) in CALABARZON, the three-day training included lectures and practical exercises on using modern diagnostic tools for nutrient and water management such as the MOET App, Leaf Color Chart (LCC), and Alternate Wetting and Drying (AWD).

Developed by the Philippine Rice Research Institute (PhilRice), the MOET App is a low-cost alternative for diagnosing soil nutrient deficiencies in nitrogen, phosphorus, potassium, sulfur, zinc, and copper.

Meanwhile, the Leaf Color Computing App (PhilRice LCC) captures leaf images and evaluates nitrogen needs of the rice plant. It can also generate recommendations in addressing nutrient needs of the plant in under a minute.

On the other hand, the Alternate Wetting and Drying (AWD) technology helps

farmers save water to reduce their irrigation water consumption in rice fields without decreasing its yield.

The training also introduced knowledge on identifying emerging pests affecting palay production such as Rice Ragged Stunt Virus (RRSV) and Rice Grassy Stunt Virus (RGCV).

Apolinario Lama of Lian, Batangas was hopeful to pass along the new knowledge to his children, who will soon oversee their farm.

"Ang pinakamahalagang bagay na nakuha ko dito ay kung paano natin maipapasa ang mga natutunan sa iba, lalo na sa ating mga anak na siyang susunod na henerasyon. Kung maisasalin natin ito nang maayos, malaki ang maitutulong nito sa ating kabuhatan at ekonomiya."

For Roi Lance Baon of Nasugbu, the training was a wake-up call to embrace a modernized approach to local farming.

"Malaking bagay po ito para sa amin sapagkat may ilan pa rin sa aming mga kasama na nananatili sa nakasanayang pamamaraan at hindi bukas sa mga makabagong teknolohiya. Kaya mahalaga na ang mga natutunan natin dito ay maibahagi rin natin pag-uwi sa ating lugar. Nais ko ring hikayatin ang aking mga kasamahan na magdaos tayo ng pagpupulong upang balikan at muling talakayin ang mga aral na ating nakuha." (PB/PIA4A/ATI4A)

Pursuant to Rule 103, Section 2 of the Rules of Court, considering that the caption of the Petition appears to be one for correction of entry, this court amends the Petition to reflect the correct caption to Change of Name, thus, the new caption of this case is:

"IN THE MATTER OF PETITION FOR CHANGE OF SURNAME FROM MEHDI MOHAMMAD RAHIM POUR TO MEHDI WEBB RAHIM POUR"

Henceforth, the case caption shall be as amended.

Furthermore, acting on the petition and pursuant to Rule 103, Section 3, Rules of Court a Petition for Change of Name was filed for the change of the petitioner's name from "Mehdi Mohammad Rahim Pour" to "Mehdi Webb Rahim Pour", alleging that:

(2) the Change of name is sought because the Petitioner has suffered hardship and emotional distress due to the inclusion of the surname "Mohammad" in his birth certificate which led to discrimination, difficulty finding work, and problems applying for travel visa. The name "Mohammad" is seen as dishonorable and has worsened both personal and professional challenges. The petitioner has postponed registering his child's birth to avoid passing on the surname;

(3) The petitioner, henceforth, prays to be permitted to use the name **"MEHDI WEBB RAHIM POUR"**

The Petition will be heard at **Unit 5, 2nd floor Filinvest Main Square Malls, Bacoor Boulevard, Barangay Bayanan, Bacoor City, Cavite on 21 January 2026 at 10:00 in the morning.** all persons interested may appear and take part in the proceedings.

Let this Order be published, at least, once a week for three (3) successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation to be chosen by raffle, the last publication of which must be more than four (4) months before the date of hearing.
