MPT South volunteer employees assisted in collecting 65 kg of residual waste and 48 kg of other debris in the coastline of Santa Rosa, accumulating to 12,039 kilograms of waste removed from its coast; on the other hand, a total of 43.5 kg of wood debris and 60.5 kg of plastic and foam materials were collected by MPT South volunteers

in the coast of Bacoor, resulting in a total of 7,275 kilograms of waste collected from the coastal area. Efforts like these continue to pave the way in raising awareness about marine conservation, proper waste segregation, and promoting sustainable practices among its volunteers.

Indang Strengthens Barangay Anti-Drug Efforts Through ADAC Summit 2025



Tagaytay City, October 6, 2025 — In support of the national government's intensified campaign against illegal drugs and the goal of building drug-resistant communities, the Municipality of Indang successfully held the Indang Anti-Drug Abuse Council (ADAC) Summit 2025 at Hotel Casiana, Tagaytay City.

The summit featured the Program Orientation on Strengthening Institutional Capacities of the Barangay Anti-Drug Abuse Council (SI-

CAP-BADAC) and Adbokasiva LABan sa Ilegal na Droga (ALAB), which brought together 216 participants composed of BADAC Chairpersons, Advocacy and Operations Chairs, Sangguniang Kabataan officials, Barangay Secretaries, and Chief Tanods from Indang's 36 barangays.

The orientation aimed to enhance the capability of barangay leaders to develop, implement, and sustain effective anti-drug programs at the grassroots level.

Key discussion topics included the SICAP-BAD-AC Module, which covered standardized BADAC guidelines, organizational structures, performance assessment tools, and the sustainability of the Barangay Drug Clearing Program. Other topics focused on the National Anti-Drug Strategy, DILG Memorandum Circular 2018-01, and Republic Act 9165, the Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002.

The ALAB session introduced participants to community-based advocacy frameworks, engagement strategies, and successful anti-drug campaigns, along with insights into the Drug-Free Workplace Program and Drug Abuse Prevention Education initiatives.

Representatives from keyagencies such as the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), Philippine National Police (PNP), and the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) were also present to provide technical guidance and support.

To preserve the siopao business her husband has started, Teodorica Cabales from Calapan City dedicated herself to perfecting a recipe that would win the hearts of many

Originally from San Teodoro, Teodorica later settled in Calapan City with her family. Life was not easy early on. After finishing elementary school, she began working as a household helper for relatives. As she grew older, she continued working as a helper for different families. At 16, she chose to live with her partner, longing for some- Last September 15 to 19, one she could depend on.

Her husband was a meat butcher, while she became a meat vendor at a local market. The couple spent many years working side by side in the market. Then in 1989, her husband decided to venture into the siopao business.

The story behind the business

Teodorica's husband often delivered meat to a siopao store, which sparked his interest in starting a similar business. Encouraged by the idea, he decided to give it

However, just a year later, and for some reason, he decided to drop the venture, which pushed Teodorica to take over. With no prior knowledge of siopao making, the process initially proved difficult for her, but she persevered tirelessly until she developed a siopao recipe she was proud of.

To promote her product, she personally went from place to place, selling at stalls, schools, and neighborhoods. What began with a simple cart eventually evolved into a mobile food cart mounted on a tricycle in 2018.

With the help of her children, they can produce around 300 pieces of siopao each day. One of her children helps her make the siopao, while the other takes charge of selling it. Their production starts at 10:00 am and ends at 2:00 pm, and they sell it from 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm.

Even her other children, now living in Batangas and Laguna, have followed their footsteps and started their own siopao business, carrying on the family legacy.

For over three decades, Teodorica's business has stood the test of time. Through all the years, she has remained committed to maintaining the same quality and taste that keeps customers coming back.

Whenever she falls short on capital, she turns to CARD Bank, a microfinance-oriented rural bank. She became a client in 2007 and has since relied on the institution for business loans to support her siopao business. Currently, she has a loan of PHP 150,000.00, which she uses to purchase raw materials, especially now that prices are continuously increasing.

Teodorica offers her siopao at affordable prices, ranging from PHP 15.00 to PHP 30.00, ensuring that everyone can enjoy and experience the taste of her product.

"For the future of my business, my biggest hope is to have my own store. I am working hard every day, together with my children, to make that dream come true,"

Launched by the Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Training Institute (DA ATI) in CALABAR-ZON, the three-day training included lectures and practical exercises on using modern diagnostic tools for nutrient and water management such as the MOET App, Leaf Color Chart (LCC), and Alternate Wetting and Drying (AWD).

Developed by the Philippine Rice Research Institute (PhilRice), the MOET App is a low-cost alternative for diagnosing soil nutrient deficiencies in nitrogen, phosphorus, potassium, sulfur,

Meanwhile, the Leaf Color Computing App (PhilRice LCC) captures leaf images and evaluates nitrogen needs of the rice plant. It can also generate recommendations in addressing nutrient needs of the plant in under


