

MPTC GEARS UP FOR HOLY WEEK WITH THE “BIYAHENG ARANGKADA” MOTORIST ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Metro Pacific Tollways Corporation (MPTC), concessionaire of NLEX, SCTEX, NLEX Connector, Manila- Cavite Expressway (CAVITEX), Cavite-Laguna Expressway (CALAX), and Cebu-Cordova Expressway (CCLEX) is rolling out its robust “Biyaheng Arangkada Semana Santa” motorist assistance program from April 16-21,2025. For CAVITEX, MPTC is implementing the program in partnership with its joint venture partner Philippine Reclamation Authority through PEA Tollway Corporation. This road safety initiative aims to provide a comfortable and stress-free journey for all motorists during peak seasons such as Holy Week in MPTC’s extensive network of expressways.

With an expected 10% increase in traffic volume during this period, MPTC has developed a multi-faceted strategy centered on providing a range of **enhanced assistance services, increasing toll plaza efficiency through RFID awareness campaigns and promoting responsible road safety practices.**

MPTC President and CEO Jose K. Ma. Lim affirms: “MPTC’s role during Holy Week goes beyond traffic management by taking measures towards ensuring a travel experience that’s safe, seamless, and reassuring. ‘Biyaheng Arangkada Semana Santa’ reflects our commitment to service that anticipates the needs of our motorists and helps families reconnect and travel with peace of mind.”

Enhanced Roadside Assistance and Support Services: MPTC is significantly bolstering its on-ground presence with an array of readily available assistance for motorists who may encounter emergencies on the road:

- On-call assistance services for roadside emergencies; a dedicated hotline (1-35000) and the MPT DriveHub app is available 24/7.
- Roadside assistance stations are strategically positioned along the tollways.
- Enhanced Traffic Operations: More than 2,000 personnel along all MPTC expressways will be deployed as early as April 8 to manage traffic flow effectively and respond swiftly to incidents.
- Free on-call Emergency Medical Services: Well-equipped medical teams will be on standby to provide immediate assistance in case of medical emergencies along the expressways.
- Free Basic Mechanical Service at select Rest nd Refuel Stations: Motorists may avail complimentary basic mechanical checks and minor repairs at designated rest and refuel stations along the MPTC network.
- Free Towing Service at the nearest exit for Class 1 vehicles and Class 1M (for CCLEX) to provide immediate relief in case of vehicle breakdowns:

 - Free health and wellness consultation (Provided by MWell) in select NLEX Rest and Refuel stations.
 - Availability of Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging stations (Provided by AC Mobility) in select areas of NLEX.

 - If your RFID is unreadable, have it checked and replaced at designated service centers.
 - Always carry your RFID card as a backup to ensure uninterrupted travel.

Travelers can observe critical road safety reminders to promote responsible driving practices:
 - Conduct a thorough pre-trip vehicle inspection before embarking on your travel. Pay close attention to tires, fluids, lights, and brakes to prevent unexpected breakdowns.
 - Stay alert and well-rested. Take regular breaks at designated rest and refuel areas to combat fatigue during long drives. Prioritize getting sufficient sleep before your trip.

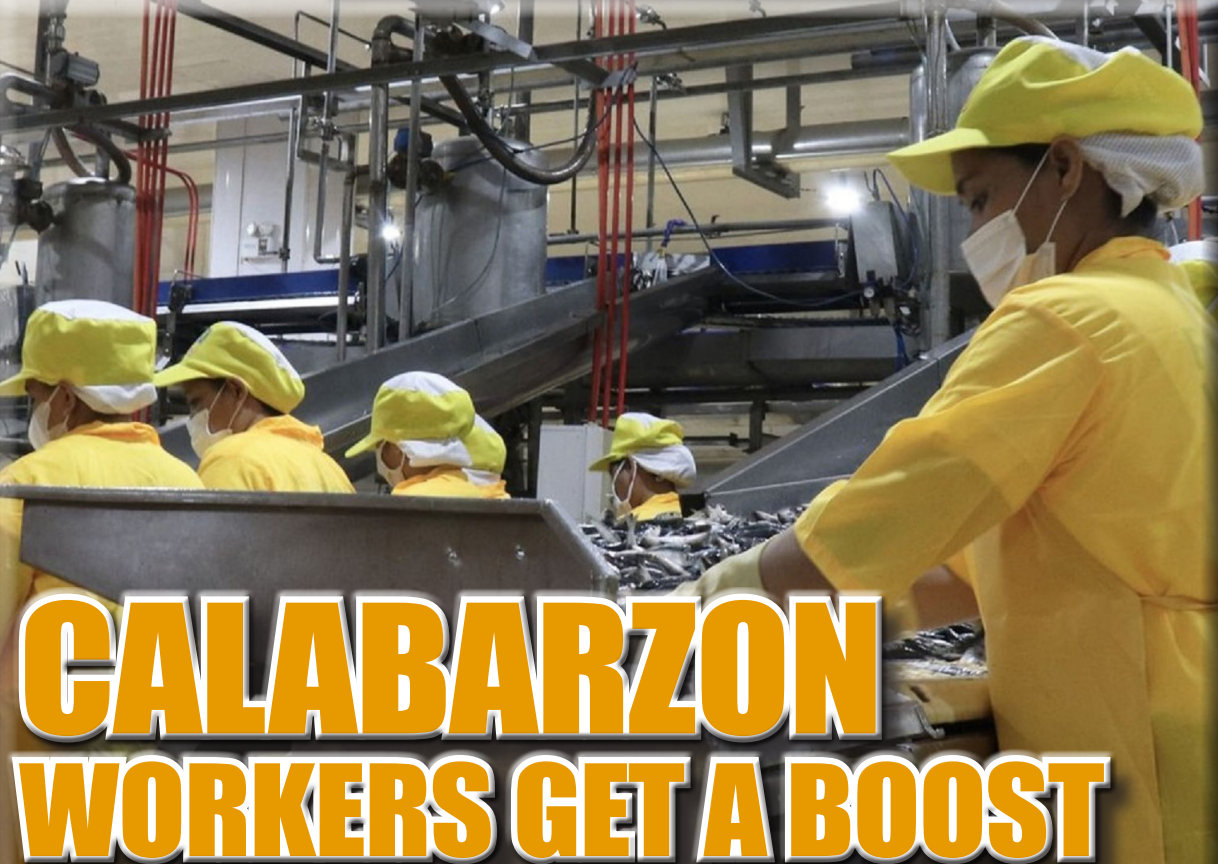

DSWD...

CALAMBA CITY (PIA) — The Department of Social Welfare and Development Field Office IV-A has started training a total of 1,650 youth who will serve as tutors under the “Tara Basa! Tutoring Program (TBTP).”

On April 1, the DSWD IV-A launched its capacity-building sessions for tutors and youth development workers who will support the Tara Basa! Tutoring Program.

The DSWD IV-A expects a total of 1,00 tutors and 550 youth development workers from various state and local universities and colleges in Cavite and Quezon provinces.

Tutoring sessions under TBTP are set to begin on May 19.

According to the DSWD, the volunteers—mostly college students pursuing education and social sciences degrees—will provide tutorial

sessions to incoming Grade 2 pupils. They will also conduct Nanay-Tatay sessions with the parents.

During a capacity-building session attended by 51 college students from the Polytechnic University of the Philippines – Unisan, Laarni Reintegrado, DSWD IV-A Innovations Division officer-in-charge, reminded the volunteers that the program is an opportunity to help learners enrich their reading skills.

“Sa programang ito, hindi lamang ito tungkol sa matatanggap ninyong educational assistance. Mahalaga ang inyong magiging kontribusyon sa paggabay sa mga bata upang mapaulad ang kanilang pagbabasa, magkaroon ng kumpyansa sa sarili, at mas pahalagahan ang kanilang pag-aaral.”

While participating in the program is an

achievement for the volunteers, Reintegrado encouraged them to show genuine care for the learners and parents involved in the program.

Launched in 2023, Tara Basa! Tutoring program is the DSWD’s developmental and community-based social protection program that provides aid for low-income families and college students through a Cash for Work system. It aims to train students from State Universities and Colleges (SUC) to teach underprivileged and struggling readers in public elementary schools.

It is currently being implemented in Bacoor City, Cavite as well as various parts of Quezon Province, aimed to improve the literacy skills of children identified as non-readers or struggling readers. (PB-PIA4A/DSWD Region IV-A)

CALABARZON..

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite (PIA) — Private workers across Calabarzon are now set to fully benefit from the wage hike approved by the regional wage board last year, as the second tranche of the increase takes effect.

With the latest adjustment, workers in the non-agriculture sector in component cities and first-class municipalities will receive an additional P20, raising their daily minimum wage from P520 to P540.

Meanwhile, non-ag-

riculture workers in fourth, fifth, and sixth-class municipalities will receive a P30 increase, elevating their daily minimum wage from P420 to P450.

The Wage Board added that workers in the agriculture sector in first-class municipalities will receive an increase of P35, adjusting their daily minimum wage from P465 to P500.

“These adjustments follow the initial tranche implemented on September 30, 2024, and are part of the govern-

ment’s ongoing efforts to ensure fair compensation for workers in the region,” the Regional Tripartite Wages and Productivity Board Calabarzon (RTWPB IV-A) said in a statement. The RTWPB IV-A advised employers to comply with the new wage rates to avoid penalties, while workers are encouraged to stay informed about their updated compensation entitlements. (RBF, FSC, PIA4A)

Cavite Medical-Dental Mission Brings Free Health Services to Dasmariñas Residents

DTI-Laguna and CMDC Empower Trainees Through Livelihood Seminar in Calamba



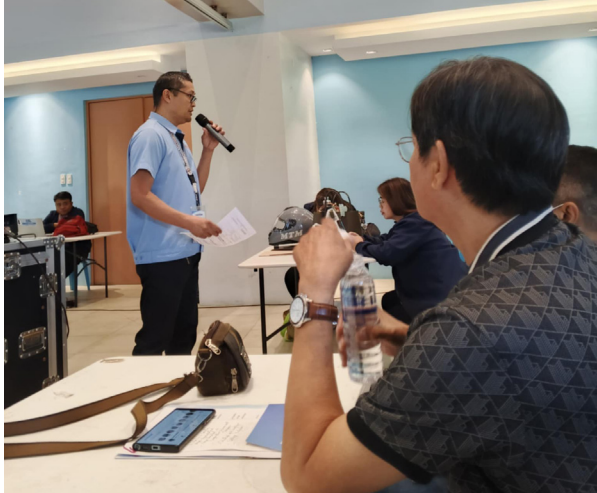

PREVENTIVE...

The Calamba City Health Office located in Brgy. VII, Calamba City and Cuba Urban Health Center located in Brgy. Punta, Calamba City are now accredited as the First Dental Clinics nationwide to provide the preventive oral health services in primary care.

Through its Accreditation and Quality Assurance Section (AQAS) and Local Health Insurance (LHIO) Calamba City, PhilHealth Regional Office IV-A (PRO IV-A) has facilitated the accreditation of the said facilities with a validity period from February 18, 2025 to December 31, 2025. This initiative ensures that members and their qualified dependents

can avail themselves of routine preventive oral care. This provision includes mandatory services such as:

- mouth examination or oral screenings
- dental prophylaxis (cleaning)
- fluoride varnish application

On the other hand, the pit and fissure sealant application or root surface protection/Class V restoration (limited to two teeth per year) and emergency tooth extractions can be availed as applicable only.

PhilHealth beneficiaries can avail themselves of the Preventive Oral Health Services through the Konsulta Package Provider (KPP) where they

are registered.

The KPPs that are direct service providers will provide oral health services to their PhilHealth Konsulta clients within their catchment population through their own dental/oral health service or clinic. On the other hand, KPPs that are referring facilities shall assign and refer their clients to their affiliate PhilHealth-accredited primary dental care clinics for the provision of oral health services.

More dental clinics are anticipated to be accredited to provide preventive oral health services so that patients can easily and conveniently avail it. /PR

CAYETANO...

Senator Alan Peter Cayetano on Thursday questioned the government's handing of former President Rodrigo Duterte to the custody of the International Criminal Court (ICC), pointing to potential legal misrepresentations in the documents submitted to the tribunal.

"The representative of the Philippine government should not just sign — he should have noted there 'Surrendered to,' 'Not applicable,' et cetera. Kasi ang titingnan ng ICC, y'ung dokumento, hindi y'ung paliwanag," Cayetano said during the continuation of the Senate on Committee of Foreign Relations' hearing on the arrest of the former president April 10, 2025. He was referring to the form titled "Information on the Surrender and Transfer," which was signed by Special Envoy on Transnational Crime Markus Lacanilao. The form indicated that Duterte received legal assistance during a "national proceeding" — a claim Cayetano said could give a misleading impression.

"While it's pending, it might be safer to allow the Filipinos to seek redress here kasi pag nandoon na, wala nang rewind," he said.

Cayetano also questioned Philippine National Police (PNP)-Criminal Investigation and Detection Group (CIDG) chief Nicolas Torre III for denying Vice President Sara Duterte entry to see her father during deten-

"When the ambassador signed his name and ang nakalagay na he (Duterte) received legal assistance during a national proceeding, it gives the impression that there was more than just the service of the warrant," he said.

Cayetano pointed out that the form was critical to showing compliance with human rights obligations, including the appearance of the accused in a local court. He urged the Department of Justice to consider how future cases should be handled, especially while the legality of the country's ICC withdrawal is still being reviewed by the Supreme Court.

tion, citing Republic Act No. 7438 which guarantees detained individuals the right to be visited by immediate family and medical professionals of their choice.

"Hindi ba siya anak? Ang nakalagay dito [sa batas], '...The person's immediate family should include his or her spouse, fiancé, parent, or child,'" he said.

Cayetano said the issues should not be dismissed as procedural lapses, warning that actions taken in high-profile cases could influence how frontline law enforcers carry out their duties in future situations.

"Kung ako ay bagong pulis sa Batanes o sa sulok ng Davao, tapos nakita ko na pwedeng hindi papasukin ang doktor o pamilya, baka akalain ko pwede rin sa amin," he said.

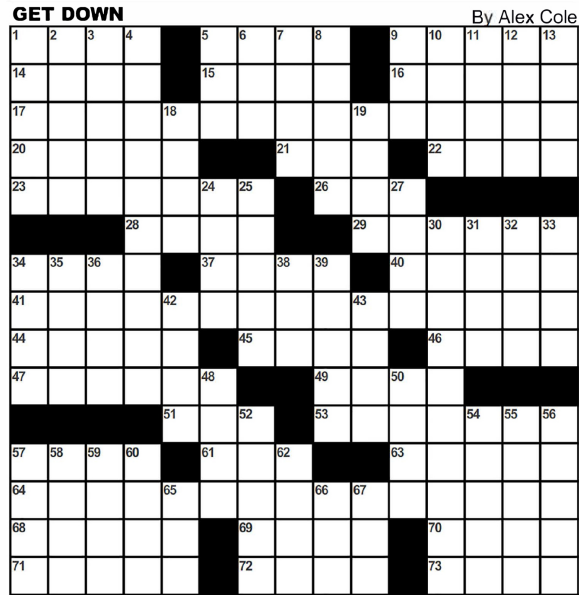

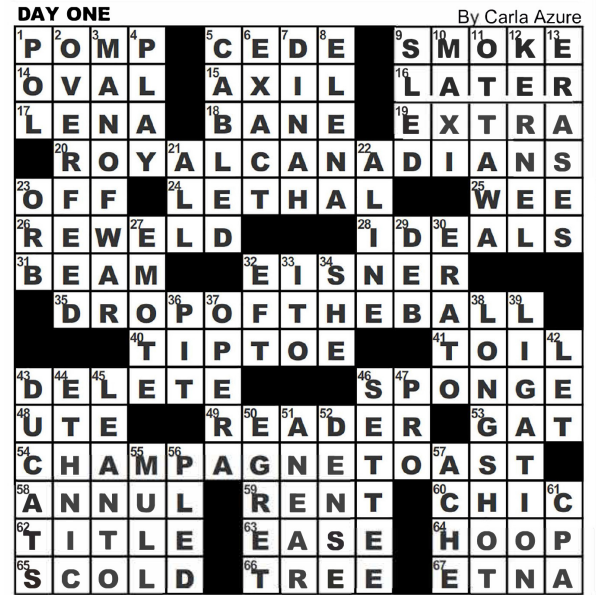
