

CALABARZON, C. VISAYAS BOARDS OK MINIMUM WAGE HIKE



MANILA – The Regional Tripartite Wages and Productivity Boards (RTWPPBs) of Region 4-A (Calabarzon) and Region 7 (Central Visayas) have issued wage orders granting increases in the daily minimum wage rates of workers in private establishments, directly benefiting 1.2 million minimum wage earners.

In a statement Monday, the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) said the daily wage adjustment in Calabarzon and Central Visayas ranges from PHP21 to PHP75 and PHP33 to PHP43, respectively.

This brings the minimum wage rates in Calabarzon to PHP450 to PHP560 in the non-agriculture sector; PHP425 to PHP500 in the agriculture sector; and PHP425 in retail and service establishments employing not more than 10 workers upon full implementation of all tranches.

The wage hike in Calabarzon will take effect on Sept. 30 or six days from the anniversary date of the previous regional wage increase on Sept. 24 last year. It will be given in two tranches -- the first tranche on Sept. 30 and the second tranche on April 1, 2025.

Meanwhile, the wage hike in Central Visayas would take effect on Oct. 2, the day immediately following the anniversary date of the previous regional wage order on Oct. 1 last year.

The region kept its area-based classifications of Classes A, B, and C, but each class now has a single wage rate for both agriculture and non-agriculture sectors.

The increase brings the daily minimum wages from PHP458 to PHP468 to PHP501 for Class A; from PHP425 to P430 to P463 for Class B; and PHP415-P420 to PHP453 for Class C.

Classified under Class A are the cities of Carcar, Cebu, Danao, Lapulapu, Mandaue, Naga, Talisay and the municipalities of Compostela, Consolacion, Cordova, Liloan, Minglanilla, San Fernando or Expanded Metro Cebu.

Meanwhile, under Class B are the cities not covered under Class A -- Bais, Bayawan, Bogo, Canlaon, Dumaguete, Guihulungan, Tagbilaran City, Tanjay and Toledo while Class C include other towns not covered under Class A and B.

Both adjustments were reached through consensus and unanimously approved by the government, labor and employer representatives in both RTWPPBs. The National Wages and Productivity Commission also unanimously affirmed the pay adjustments.

The wage orders were issued following President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s Labor Day directive to the RTWPPBs to review regional minimum wage rates prior to the anniversary dates of previous wage increases. (PNA)



Participants can also inquire at booths from potential franchise or business opportunities. And to assist the entrepreneurs in their regulatory affairs, government agencies are on hand to answer questions on documentation, certifications, and applications.

DOT, DMW LEAD MAJOR JOB FAIRS IN TOURISM AND SEAFARING INDUSTRIES AT SMX MANILA

In a continued effort to provide valuable career opportunities for Filipinos, the Department of Tourism (DOT) and the Department of Migrant Workers (DMW) successfully held two major job fairs at the SMX Convention Center Manila this September, bringing together thousands of job seekers with top employers in the tourism and maritime sectors.



From fresh graduates to displaced workers, attendees at the job fairs have the opportunity to explore career paths in the thriving Philippine tourism and hospitality industries.



Shortly after, on September 22, 2024, the DMW's Disenteng Trabaho para sa Marinong Filipino, in celebration of the 29th National Seafarers' Day further solidified the government's support for the Filipino seafaring community. The job fair, in collaboration with BDO, connected thousands of maritime professionals and aspiring seafarers with over 30 licensed manning agencies, offering roles in cruise lines, cargo ships, and offshore facilities. In his speech, DMW Secretary Hans Leo Cacdac said that job fairs are important in providing opportunities to our seafarers and in ensuring that they go through the legal recruitment process.

These job fairs underscore the importance of collaboration between the public and private sectors in creating opportunities for Filipinos. By providing a venue for these initiatives, SM Supermalls continues to support efforts that help drive economic recovery and provide access to job opportunities in key industries like tourism and maritime. /PR

MPT SOUTH TO SERVE OVER 340,000 MOTORISTS IN 2025



MPT South forecasts more than 30% traffic growth by the end of 2025, translating to over 340,000 average daily motorists, a significant increase from the current figure of 259,815. This growth will be driven by the completion of several key segments of the Cavite-Laguna Expressway (CALAX) and CAVITEX C5 Link. These segments include the CALAX Governor's Drive Interchange, Open Canal Interchange, and Kawit Interchange, as well as the C5 Link Segment 3B, which will connect the current Sucat Interchange to the C5 Link Flyover Extension, spanning from SLEX-Taguig to E. Rodriguez in C5. The CAVITEX-CALAX Link, currently under construction, will integrate these two major toll roads, creating a more seamless connection for motorists.



These projects are slated for commercial operations before the end of 2025, bringing MPT South's total road network to 67 km. The new segments, designed to enhance travel time and accessibility, are expected to encourage more motorists to utilize the network, further boosting traffic flow in the region. This will improve connectivity and travel efficiency between major provinces in Southern Luzon, easing travel for daily commuters and businesses alike.



"Aside from providing an enhanced driving experience for our motorists, our projects also aim to contribute to the region's economic development by improving accessibility and connectivity. Once completed, our expressway network will provide a more seamless travel experience for over 340,000 motorists, a 30% increase from our existing daily traffic, and help spur economic growth in both regions," said MPT South President and General Manager, Mr. Raul L. Ignacio. In line with this, MPT South is allocating Php14 billion in capital expenditures (CAPEX) in 2025 to support the construction and maintenance of its infrastructure. "Despite the challenges we face in construction, such as the timely delivery of right-of-way and the recent typhoons, we are working around the clock to ensure the delivery of these vital infrastructure projects for the benefit of progress by the end of 2025," Ignacio added. Upon completion, MPT South's expressway network is expected to boost regional economic growth by facilitating quicker, more efficient movement of goods and services between key industrial and commercial hubs. The shortened travel time will provide additional benefits such as reduced fuel consumption and lower vehicle emissions, contributing to nation-building and improving the quality of life for Filipinos.



Kawit, Cavite - On Friday, September 28, 2024, at least 120,000 indigent residents in Cavite received various forms of assistance from the national government during the Bagong Pilipinas Serbisyo Fair (BPSF), held at Emilio Aguinaldo Elementary School in Kawit.

Speaker Martin Romualdez, accompanied by 200 members of the House of Representatives, led the service caravan, which aimed to bring essential services closer to the people. "Together with our lawmakers, we are making a meaningful impact in our communities," Romualdez said, expressing confidence in the continued success of the BPSF initiative.

The Cavite event is part of a broader government effort to visit all 82 provinces, ensuring that vital services reach Filipinos nationwide. Romualdez noted that the assistance provided—ranging from cash and medical aid to scholarships and livelihood programs valued at PHP1 billion—has significantly improved the lives of thousands of Caviteños. "With this kind of collaboration and community involvement, we are ensuring that government services reach even the most remote areas," he added. Romualdez also highlighted that 25,000 Caviteños benefited from three of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s flagship financial assistance programs, which were rolled out in the province to support vulnerable sectors, students, and small entrepreneurs.

These programs include the Cash Assistance and Rice Distribution (CARD) Program, the Integrated Scholarships and Incentives for the Youth (ISIP) Program, and the Start-Up, Investments, Business Opportunities, and Livelihood (SIBOL) Program, all designed to provide much-needed relief to citizens not covered by traditional social aid programs like the 4Ps. As part of the CARD Program, 10,000 beneficiaries from across Cavite each received PHP5,000 in cash and 10 kilograms of rice in a simple distribution ceremony at the Imus City Grandstand. The program, initiated by Romualdez, supports vulnerable groups such as indigent senior citizens, persons with disabilities, single parents, and indigenous peoples to help meet their daily living expenses. The funds came from the Department of Social Welfare and Development's (DSWD) Ayuda Para sa Kapos ang Kita Program (AKAP). Under the ISIP Program, 5,000 students received PHP5,000 in financial aid and five kilograms of rice during a distribution event at Bacoor Elementary School. This program, also spearheaded by Romualdez, aims to support students pursuing tertiary or vocational education. Funds were sourced from the DSWD's Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situations (AICS). Beneficiaries also enjoy additional support, such as access to scholarships under the Commission on Higher Education's Tulong Dunong Program (TDP), internship opportunities through the Government Internship Program (GIP), and job placements for their unemployed parents through the DOLE-TUPAD Program.



Meanwhile, the SIBOL Program saw 10,000 micro, small, and medium enterprise (MSME) beneficiaries receive PHP5,000 in financial assistance and five kilograms of rice during a distribution event at Maple Grove, General Trias. The AKAP program also provided the funds for this initiative. "These programs demonstrate our commitment to ensuring that no Filipino is left behind. Whether through education, financial aid, or entrepreneurship, we are creating opportunities for growth," Romualdez stated.

In addition, Romualdez participated in the BPSF at the Imus Track Oval, where 10,000 indigent residents received cash and medical assistance, as well as access to livelihood programs. One beneficiary, Julieta Trinidad from Mary Cris Homes in Imus, expressed her gratitude for the financial assistance. "The PHP5,000 and 10 kilos of rice are a huge help. This will allow us to buy medicine for my husband," she said, as her husband Reynaldo continues to recover from a stroke. (PNA)

BONG GO...

Senator Christopher "Bong" Go continues his mission to bring essential public services closer to Filipinos, especially the poor, sick, and vulnerable. As Chair of the Senate Committee on Health and Demography, Go highlighted the importance of ensuring that all Filipinos have access to healthcare and assistance for those in need. On September 25, Go personally attended the inauguration of a new Super Health Center in Dasmariñas City, Cavite, in partnership with Mayor Jenny Austria-Barzaga. During the event, Go also extended assistance to indigent residents of the city. "Many people thanked me earlier for our programs that helped them, but honestly, I am the one who should be thanking you for giving me the opportunity to serve," Go said. He added, "My only offering to you is my dedication to work because serving others has become my passion."

A total of 1,667 struggling individuals, including persons with disabilities (PWDs), parents of children in special education (SPED), women, solo parents, and senior citizens, gathered at the Dasmariñas Arena. They received food packs, snacks, vitamins, masks, shirts, foldable fans, and sports equipment such as basketballs and volleyballs. Some beneficiaries were also given shoes, mobile phones, bicycles, and watches.

As an adopted son of the CALABARZON region, Go collaborated with the Dasmariñas City government to provide financial assistance to identified low-income sectors. In addition to supporting the vulnerable, Go led the inauguration of the Super Health Center, a key initiative he champions to improve healthcare accessibility across the country. He stressed the importance of building such facilities, particularly in rural areas,

to bring healthcare services closer to the people. "The Super Health Centers we've built have had a significant impact on communities, especially in rural areas. The goal is to bring government healthcare services closer to the people," Go explained. He also reaffirmed his commitment to establishing more Super Health Centers across the country. These centers offer primary care, medical consultations, and early disease detection, helping to reduce hospital congestion and strengthen community-level healthcare services. Through the efforts of Go, fellow lawmakers, the Department of Health (DOH) under Secretary Teodoro "Ted" Herbosa, and local government units, funding was secured for more than 700 Super Health Centers nationwide, including 17 in Cavite. In support of community health workers, Go also distributed grocery packs, snacks, shirts, and sports equipment to 205 barangay health workers (BHWs) and Barangay Nutrition Scholars (BNS) who were present. Responding to the pleas of healthcare workers, Go said he has been pushing the DOH and the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) to expedite the release of the long-overdue Health Emergency Allowance (HEA) for qualified health workers. He also thanked the local government for their efforts in realizing the Super Health Center. In particular, he expressed gratitude to Mayor Austria-Barzaga, Board Members Jun dela Cuesta and Nickol Austria, and local councilors.

Mayor Barzaga, in turn, expressed her heartfelt thanks to Go for his unwavering support to the city, particularly in health services and infrastructure projects. "We want to thank him... We wouldn't be here without him (Senator Go). He is a friend of

Dasmariñas. His passion isn't just to serve, but also to help Dasmariñas," Mayor Barzaga said.

She added, "His priority is to ensure the health of our people. That's his happiness, beyond serving, it's helping others."


During the event, Go also extended further assistance to individuals with medical needs, advising them to seek help from nearby Malasakit Centers located at the Southern Tagalog Regional Hospital in Bacoor City and Gen. Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital in Trece Martires City. Malasakit Centers, a one-stop shop for medical assistance programs, aim to help poor patients reduce their hospital expenses. Go is the principal author and sponsor of Republic Act No. 11463, or the Malasakit Centers Act of 2019, which institutionalized the program. Currently, there are 166 operational Malasakit Centers across the country, and the Department of Health reports that nearly 12 million Filipinos have already benefited from the program. /PR
