FIRST P2P BUS SERVICE FROM IMUS TO NAIA LAUNCHED

IMUS CITY, Cavite (PIA) — Cavite's first point-to-point (P2P) bus service from Imus to all terminals of the Ninoy Aquino International Airport was launched on Monday, November 18 marking a milestone for Cavite commuters and travelers. Cavite Third District Rep. Jay Advincula, Imus City Mayor Alex Advincula, Lina Group of Companies Chairman Alberto Lina, UBE Express President Garrie A. David, and Ayala Land Mall Inc. Terminal Senior Associate Manager Ivan D. Bautista led the ceremonial launch. Mayor Advincula said the premium bus service, which will cater to Overseas Filipino Work-

ers (OFWs) and locals, is more affordable than other service platforms and taxi providers. Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA) Administrator Arnell Ignacio, who also attended the event, said the P2P buses will benefit OFWs and local tourists with the special rates offered. "All who initiated this project—the private sector and city officials—will hold a special place in the hearts of OFWs and their families for providing them with a comfortable journey to every destination where they will work," Ignacio said. 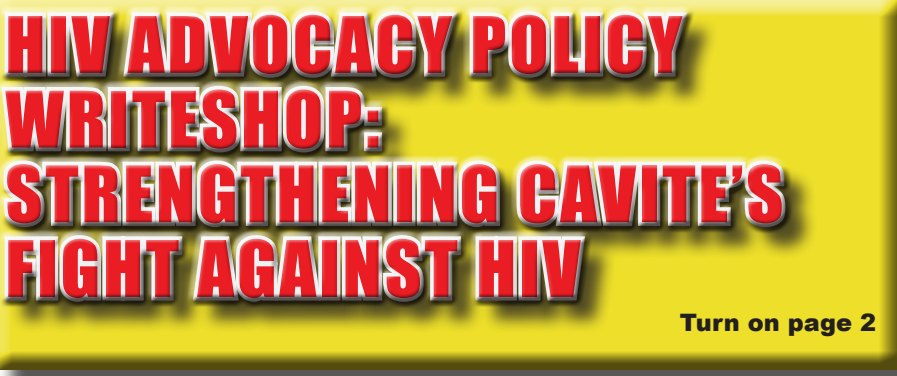

A BETTER-EQUIPPED SAN JOSE DISTRICT HEALTH CENTER

In its commitment to uplift lives and drive social good nationwide, the SM Group, through SM Foundation, turned over the newly rehabilitated San Jose District Health Center in Tacloban City. This marks SM Foundation's 211th Wellness Center.

The San Jose District Health Center serves around 43,575 residents of Tacloban City, offering a wide range of health services including family planning, prenatal and postnatal care, birthing, child care, TB DOTS, minor consultations, maintenance medication provision, and adolescent wellness consultations. **A renewed facility for better healthcare**

Established in 2010, the district health center sustained severe damage in 2013 during Typhoon Yolanda, which destroyed its structure, medical equipment, medicines, and records. Recognizing its vital role in the community, SM Foundation stepped in to rehabilitate the facility to meet modern healthcare standards.

The renovated center is now equipped with key upgrades such as a dedicated breastfeeding area, an adolescent consultation space, a well-stocked pharmacy, delivery and recovery rooms, a nurse's station with on-duty quarters, PWD-friendly toilets, and sustainable features like a rainwater catchment system and air-cleaning paints that enhance indoor air quality while promoting environmental sustainability.

Further supporting its operations, SM Foundation also provided laptops to digitize patient records, enabling online consultations for residents in remote areas, improving data management, and streamlining administrative processes. These efforts also facilitate the enrollment of patients in PhilHealth Konsulta benefits.

The rehabilitation of the San Jose District Health Center coincided with the periodic maintenance of the Tacloban City Hospital and the 11th anniversary of Savemore's presence in the city. Trece Martires City, Cavite – In a united effort to combat HIV, AIDS, and sexually transmitted infections (STIs) in the province, the Office of the Provincial Health Officer (OPHO), in partnership with Pilipinas Shell Foundation, Inc. and Initiatives for Dialogue and Empowerment Through Alternative Legal Services (IDEALS) Inc., spearheaded a two-day HIV Advocacy Local Policy Dialogue and Ordinance Writeshop on November 21-22, 2024. The event was held at the Cavite Collaboration Center for Public Health, located in the GEAMH Compound.

The writeshop brought together healthcare professionals, including doctors and nurses from municipal and city health offices, alongside members of the Cavite Province Multi-sectoral STI, HIV, AIDS Council (CPAC). Its goal was

to develop actionable points and foster collaboration toward enacting local legislation that strengthens the prevention, control, and treatment of HIV, AIDS, and STIs in Cavite.

Ms. Haydelisa Maderazo, Provincial HIV Program Coordinator, opened the event with an in-depth presentation on the current HIV situation in Cavite, laying the groundwork for discussions on urgent policy reforms. Participants also received a comprehensive lecture on Republic Act 11166, the Philippine HIV and AIDS Policy Act, to deepen their understanding of existing laws and their relevance to local needs.

The IDEALS legal experts led key sessions on Policy Framework Building, Policy Development and Systems Thinking, Identifying Interventions, and Addressing Delivery

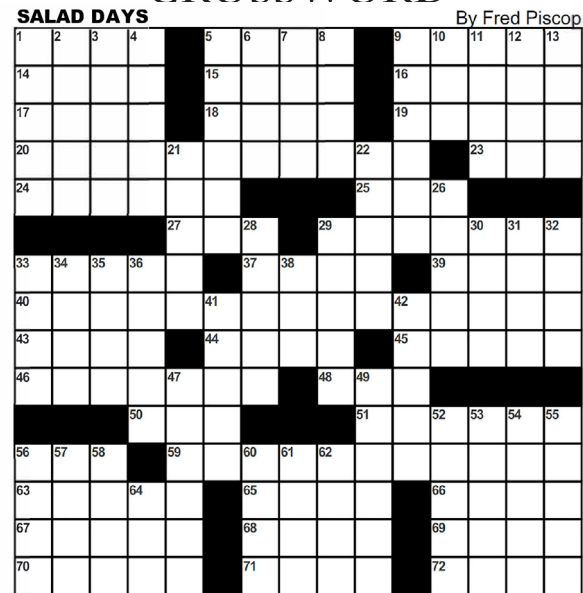
Challenges...

The two-day event culminated in the formulation of an action plan, detailing strategies, activities, and timelines to push for the adoption of a local HIV ordinance. The participants aimed to endorse the proposed legislation to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan for approval and eventual enactment.

This writeshop emphasized the power of multi-sectoral collaboration and equipped stakeholders with the tools and knowledge needed to tackle the challenges of HIV in Cavite effectively. It stands as a significant step forward in safeguarding public health and enhancing the province's response to the ongoing HIV epidemic. /CPIO

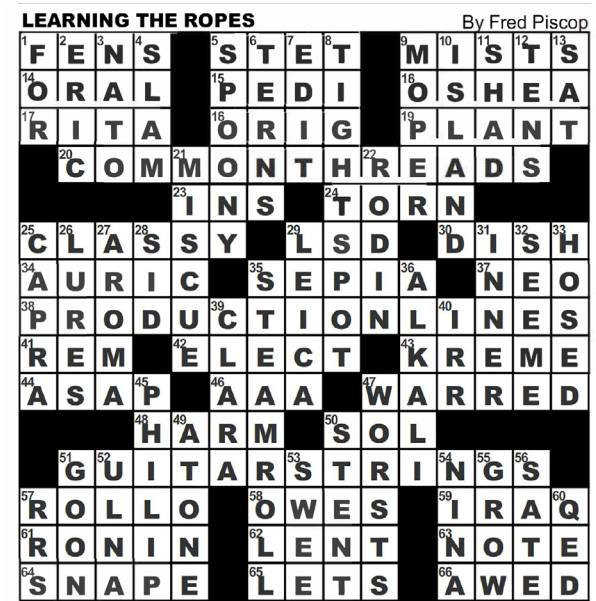
