SANTA ROSA CITY, Laguna (PIA) – The Commission on Elections (COMELEC) announced that it will open a more inclusive, safe and convenient voting option for senior citizens, persons with disabilities (PWDs) and pregnant women to ensure their participation in the 2025 national and local elections.

In an interview during the Ugnayan at Talakayan sa Laguna program of the Philippine Information Agency, lawyer Marx Nicholai Delmo, election officer of COMELEC in Calamba City, Laguna, stated that the implementation of early voting hours is part of the Commission's ongoing efforts to have an orderly election process.

Senior citizens, PWDs, and pregnant women may cast their ballots on May 12 at their designated precincts as early as 5:00 am

to 7:00 am.

“For the first time, in the 2025 National Elections, the Commission on Elections will implement what we call early voting hours. This will be from 5:00 AM to 7:00 AM, where all our polling places will exclusively accommodate persons with disabilities, senior citizens, and pregnant women along with their assistors. Only they will be served from 5:00 AM to 7:00 AM,” Delmo said.

Those with special needs, senior citizens, and pregnant women who belong to the priority group but are unable to vote during the said voting hours will still be accommodated through the priority lanes set up for them in every polling precinct from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm. These lanes will remain open throughout the day to allow them skip regular queues and vote with great

comfort and convenience, the Commission reiterates.

The election officer then emphasized that this system upholds the right to suffrage of every Filipinos and to maintain an organized electoral process while safeguarding the welfare of the vulnerable sectors. Meanwhile, COMELEC has warned the public to remain cautious and vigilant against false information circulating online claiming that the upcoming election has been postponed and moved to another date, clarifying that such claims are fake and not true.

Individuals spreading such false information may be held liable for an election offense under Section 261(z)(11) of the Omnibus Election Code. (RB, CO/PIA-4A)

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — The Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) in Calabarzon has strengthened its partnership with key private sector players in an effort to promote and uphold workers' rights.

“DOLE Calabarzon is actively coordinating with private companies in various ways to ensure that our workers are given the correct and lawful benefits. This includes regular labor inspections and Technical and Advisory Visits where we assist micro-enterprise proprietors in understanding and properly implementing labor laws—covering correct wage computation, statutory benefits like SSS, PhilHealth, Pag-IBIG, and compliance with Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) standards,” said DOLE Calabarzon Regional Director Erwin N. Aquino.

He emphasized that the Labor department remains hands-on in ensuring that employees across the region receive fair wages, lawful benefits, and a safe working environment. As part of these efforts, the agency marked the World Day for Safety and Health at Work on April 28, bringing together over 200 representatives from labor and management sectors.

The event highlights the importance of a strong enforcement of occupational safety and health rules, not just as a legal obligation but as a vital element in building productive, safe, and sustainable work environments.

Aquino said that they continue to observe the Single Entry Approach (SENA) as a standout mechanism for dispute resolution and in

addressing labor complaints without the need for costly and time-consuming litigation.

“When there are complaints [from the workers], we immediately mediate or conciliate conferences to resolve issues quickly and properly through Single Entry Approach or SENA,” Aquino said.

“It can also be done online, before filing a case in court or with a labor arbiter, it is first discussed through a conciliation-mediation conference. The goal of SENA is to resolve issues within just 30 days, without the need for a long process and costs,” the director explained. He added: “Through these programs, we ensure that workers' rights are protected, and at the same time we strengthen labor-management relations for a stronger industry.” (AM, CA/PIA-4A)

Cabuyao City, Laguna — TESDA Laguna took an active role in the 123rd Labor Day Celebration held on May 1, 2025, organized by the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), with the theme “Manggagawang Pilipino, Kaagapay sa Pag-unlad, Sandigan ng Mas Matatag na Bagong Pilipinas.”

Information booths were set up at Green-

shoppe Center in Cabuyao City and SM City San Pedro, where TESDA personnel assisted over 60 individuals seeking information about the agency's scholarship offerings, assessment and certification procedures, and available Technical-Vocational Education and Training (TVET) programs across the province.

The event also featured

participation from other government agencies, including Pag-IBIG Fund, PhilHealth, and the Social Security System (SSS), which provided frontline services to attendees.

Several jobseekers were hired on the spot by participating companies, with vacancies filled in fields such as driving, technical services, production, and sales. /PR

Senator Alan Peter Cayetano on Wednesday assured the public that the construction of the New Senate Building (NSB) is proceeding without delay and with an emphasis on cost efficiency.

“Full steam ahead, hindi madi-delay at ibinababang yung presyo [ng gusali],” Cayetano said in a media interview at the Senate on April 30, 2025.

Cayetano, who chairs the Senate Committee on Accounts overseeing the project, said preparations are underway for a briefing and site visit, possibly next week, depending on the schedule of Senate President Francis “Chiz” Es-

cuadero.

“I'll try to get his schedule next week... But kung hindi man, I'll just give you a one-pager so that you know the direction [of the project],” he told reporters.

The senator also expressed appreciation to former senator Panfilo “Ping” Lacson and Senator Nancy Binay, who previously chaired the accounts committee, saying the current efforts build on the transparency and direction they helped establish.

“We owe to both Senator Lacson and Senator Nancy na transparent na makita nila yung direction at yung findings,” he said.

Cayetano said about 75 percent of the committee's comprehensive report on the construction of the building, which will be submitted to the Senate, is already complete.

He clarified that his role as Accounts Committee chair is not to look into past issues but to ensure that the Senate gets “the best Senate building at the soonest possible time at the least cost.”

“Hindi ko trabaho in this committee to look for anomalies. My report will be factual,” he added. /PR

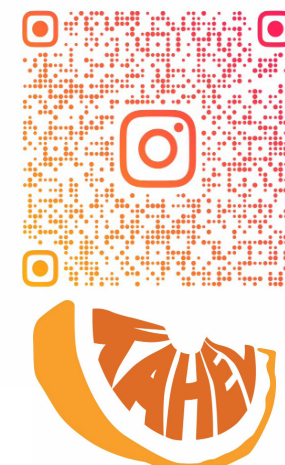

MANILA – At least two lawmakers on Friday hailed the election of Pope Leo XIV, calling it a moment of renewed hope and a reaffirmation of the Catholic Church's enduring mission. “We welcome with deep joy and reverence the election of His Holiness Pope Leo XIV,” Speaker Martin Romualdez said in a statement, issued a few hours after 133 cardinal electors chose the new leader for the world's 1.4 billion Catholics. “His life of missionary service, unwavering commitment to the marginalized, and resolute pursuit of justice reflect the best of what the Catholic Church can offer in these times of uncertainty,” he added.

Pope Leo XIV, formerly Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost, becomes the 267th leader of the Roman Catholic Church and the first US-born pontiff. Romualdez noted that Pope Leo XIV's pastoral approach, shaped largely by his work in Latin America, echoes

the leadership of his predecessor, Pope Francis, who died on Easter Monday at the age of 88. “Like Lolo Kiko, Pope Leo XIV carries the Gospel with humility and courage, entering the papacy with quiet strength,” Romualdez said. “In an age of clamor, he reminds us that humility is power, and service is the highest form of leadership.” Romualdez said the new pontiff's message resonates with Filipinos, particularly his focus on compassion and justice for the vulnerable. “The election of Pope Leo XIV affirms the Church's mission to stand with the poor, the displaced and the voiceless — one that deeply resonates with the Filipino people, especially as the Philippines remains the third-largest Catholic nation in the world,” he said. The House leader also highlighted the symbolic weight of the papal name, citing Popes Leo XIII and Leo I as figures of reform and strength. Romualdez expressed hope that Pope Leo XIV would visit the Philippines, saying such a vis-

MANILA – A PHP500,000 reward is being offered for information leading to the arrest of the suspect in the killing of former Kalibo mayor and journalist Juan “Johnny” Dayang, the Philippine National Police said (PNP) said Thursday.

In a statement, the PNP said it continues to make headway in the case of the slain veteran journalist in line with the directive of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. to prioritize

the safety and protection of members of the press.

The Police Regional Office 6 (Western Visayas) said local authorities have identified a male suspect in the killing of Dayang on April 29.

According to the initial investigation, the suspect had a prior criminal record and was arrested during an illegal drug buy-bust operation in Pasig City in May 2021.

Acidre also paid tribute to the service and spiritual legacy of Pope Francis: “We are grateful, too, for the life and witness of Pope Francis — who taught us how to love more, hope more, and serve more deeply.”

“We now pray for our new Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV. May the Lord bless him with wisdom, courage, and compassion as he leads the Church in these challenging times,” he added. (PNA)

Gen. Rommel Francisco Marbil underscored the PNP's commitment to solving the case.

“We assure the public that the PNP will not relent in our pursuit of the suspect in the killing of Mr. Johnny Dayang. His identity has been confirmed, and we are exhausting all means to bring him to justice,” Marbil said.

“We thank the Aklan Provincial Government and LGU Kalibo for their strong support in offering a reward to help expedite

his capture. This is not just about one man – it is about our collective duty to uphold press freedom and protect those who seek and speak the truth.”

Marbil further reiterated the PNP's close coordination with the Presidential Task Force on Media Security (PTFoMS) and other investigative agencies to ensure that justice is served swiftly and decisively.

He added that the PNP continues to appeal to the public for

assistance.

Dayang, 89, was a well-respected figure in Philippine journalism and had served as President Emeritus of the Publishers Association of the Philippines, Inc. (PAPI).

As the investigation progresses, the PNP remains resolute in upholding its mandate to protect every Filipino citizen, especially those in the media sector who courageously serve the cause of truth and accountability. (PNA)

LIPA CITY (PIA) — The country's first electric jeepney (e-jeepney) assembly plant has opened in Lima Park in Lipa City, Batangas.

Owned by the LCS Group of Companies and its South Korean partner Electric Mobility ON (EMON), the factory aims to produce low-cost, environmentally friendly electric jeepneys to help drivers and operators cope with the high costs of other modernized vehicles.

Each modern e-jeepney unit is priced at P1.2 million which is lower than the usual P2.5 million to P3 million price range in the market.

This initiative is a result

of the collaboration between the LCS Group and EMON, which designed the 27-seater e-jeepney, combining modern technology with the iconic Filipino jeepney design.

With this lower cost, the

LCS Group said, drivers are expected to recover their investment within two to three years. The company added that it targets to produce 500 units monthly, with plans to scale up based on demands.

The plant is also expected to provide jobs and livelihood opportunities to around 80 workers, with future expansion planned in the Visayas and Mindanao regions.

The factory is currently awaiting franchise approval from the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) to officially deploy e-jeepneys for public transport services.

In an interview with Maj. Gen. Rudolph Dimas, regional director of LTRB IV-A, the establishment of the assembly plant will create a nice atmosphere and good competition between companies offer-

ing e-jeepney.

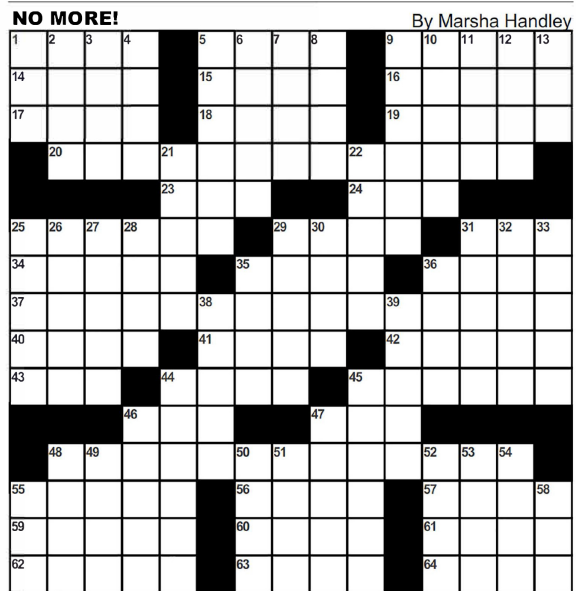
“This is the first manufacturing company in the Philippines. It is eco-friendly and cheap for the price of 1.2 million each unit compared to the 2.5- 4 million worth from others offering the same. It is very advantageous to the operators since the said company noted that in two or three years time they will be able to get back their capital,” Dimas noted.

He also mentioned that they have conducted initial coordinations and meetings with the company and requested that a unit of this e-jeepney be tested in Tagaytay with the operators to see if the units produced can traverse high slopes or terrain.

The LCS Group and EMON are engaging with different banks for possible tie-ups on the processing of loans of operators. (MPDC-PIA Batangas)
