Next on the list was the Geronimo Berenguer De Los Reyes (GBR) Museum in General Trias, a cultural gem dedicated to preserving and promoting the country’s rich history and heritage. Among the museum’s exhibits, the World Aviation History Exhibit stood out, featuring remarkable replicas such as the Wright Brothers’ “Flying Machine” and NASA’s Lunar Roving Vehicle. Afterward, Ka-Biyaheros enjoyed lunch at Cabezera Ridge View Restaurant in Tagaytay City, a dining spot that pairs Cavite flavors with sweeping views of Taal Lake.

**How to get to GBR Museum: From Manila, take CAVITEX. From Kawit, go straight to Centennial Road going to NIA Road, General Trias. Continue driving along Prinza Street to the GBR Museum.

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) continues to provide support to local government units affected by recent severe weather disturbances, with more than 4.99 million worth of assistance already extended to affected families in the region.

According to DSWD IV-A, a total of 24,814 families have been affected in Calabarzon by Typhoon Opong, as well as previous weather disturbances Mirasol, Nando, and the southwest monsoon.

Of these, more than 16,000 families remain in

795 evacuation centers across the region, most of which are located in Quezon province.

In Laguna, over 300 families received family food packs during a distribution activity held in Sta. Rosa City on September 27, 2025. These families, who are currently staying at the evacuation center in Barangay Sinalhan, were displaced from their homes due to Typhoon Opong.

The food packs are part of the more than 800,000 worth of assistance provided by the DSWD to Sta. Rosa City.

According to the local government's report to

DSWD Field Office IV-A, more than 1,000 families were affected by the recent typhoon in the city as of 4:00 PM, September 27, 2025.

The agency assured that it will continue working with local government units to address the urgent needs of affected families, especially those still staying in evacuation centers.

The Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council Calabarzon is currently assessing the impacts of Typhoon Opong in the region. (PIA 4A)

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) – The Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT) has coordinated with social media giant Meta to strengthen efforts in combating the growing threat of artificial intelligence (AI)-generated scams and online disinformation.

DICT Secretary Henry Rhoel Aguda and Meta officials have discussed strategies to counter the misuse of emerging technologies that enable the rapid creation and spread of fabricated content, including disinformation and misinformation, phishing attempts, and other digital scams targeting Filipino users.

“Part of the talks also focused on ways to eliminate and filter AI-generated videos on Facebook, since more Filipinos use this platform compared to other social media sites,” DICT Calabarzon Information Officer II Clark Christopher Sarmiento said during the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Calabarzon Na-

tional Information and Communications Technology Household Survey (NICTHS) Regional Data Dissemination Forum.

The partnership comes amid rising global concern about the impact of generative AI tools, which can produce hyper-realistic text, images, and videos that blur the line between fact and fiction.

According to the PSA 2024 NICTHS result presented on Sept. 29, individuals in Calabarzon who experienced any cyber incidents (text scams, phishing, and hacking) increased from 30 percent in 2019 to almost double at 58.5 percent in 2024.

The DICT said its Cybercrime Investigation and Coordinating Center (CICC) is closely working with law enforcement agencies and private sector partners to monitor, investigate, and take down AI-generated scams and malicious content circulating online.

The agency emphasized

that CICC's role is vital in ensuring that cases of cyber fraud and disinformation are properly addressed, while also raising public awareness on how to avoid falling victim to such schemes.

“CICC facilitates and manages incidents involving fake news and online scams, especially those that target our countrymen. They guide victims on the proper steps to take, including whether to file a complaint. The CICC is also in close coordination with the Philippine National Police Anti-Cybercrime Group,” Sarmiento said.

While the 2024 NICTHS also revealed that awareness on cybersecurity or data privacy increased by six percentage points among Filipinos in Calabarzon, DICT still encourages the public to remain vigilant online, verify information from trusted sources, and report suspicious content through official government and platform reporting channels. MUNTINLUPA CITY (PIA) – The Philippine government, through the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), has reaffirmed its commitment to work closely with the ASEAN Centre for Biodiversity (ACB) in safeguarding the nation's rich biological heritage for future generations.

During the ACB's 20th founding anniversary celebration in Muntinlupa City on September 25, DENR Undersecretary for Legal and Administration Ernesto Adobo Jr. said the Philippines “takes great pride” in being a partner of the Centre since its establishment.

“We reaffirm our commitment to work closely with the Centre and with our fellow ASEAN member states to ensure that the biological heritage of our region—one of the most diverse on Earth—remains protected for

generations to come,” Adobo said.

He emphasized that the ACB plays a critical role in uniting the region to address pressing environmental challenges such as biodiversity loss, climate change, and unsustainable resource use.

“For the past twenty years, the ACB has stood as a unifying platform for ASEAN member states, policymakers, scientists, communities, and development partners. Together, you have nurtured partnerships that remind us that the conservation of biodiversity is not the work of governments alone, but a shared responsibility across sectors,” the undersecretary added.

The ACB dates back to 1998, when the 10 ASEAN Member States, including the Philippines, launched the ASEAN Regional Centre for Biodiversity Conservation

(ARCBC) Project with funding support from the European Union. Recognizing its potential to sustain gains and respond to regional biodiversity challenges, the member states agreed to establish the ACB in 2005. Since then, the Philippines has hosted the ACB and its headquarters in Los Baños, Laguna. The Host Country Agreement was ratified on September 1, 2006, and subsequently concurred by the Senate on September 14, 2009.

Looking ahead, the ACB is set to support the Philippines as it assumes the ASEAN chairmanship in 2026.

“The Philippines will chair ASEAN next year. We are preparing for this to support the country and to be an important partner of the government as it takes on the ASEAN chairmanship,” said ACB Executive Director Dr. Jerome Montemayor in an interview with the Philippine Information Agency CALABARZON.

Montemayor highlighted the ASEAN Summit as a key platform for the ACB to engage member states and development partners in advancing biodiversity conservation, promoting sustainable use of biological resources,

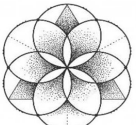
es, and ensuring the fair and equitable sharing of benefits derived from biodiversity.

“The participation of the ACB in ASEAN bodies has been vital in promoting and reporting the Centre's programs and accomplishments, which further inspires our ASEAN member countries to strengthen and expand their biodiversity initiatives,” he said.

Over the past two decades, the ACB, through its partnerships with governments and private institutions, has restored and protected 108,879 hectares of forest, implemented 29 conservation projects worth USD 59.5 million since 2014, and invested more than USD 22 million in biodiversity conservation and livelihood programs.

It also oversees 69 ASEAN Heritage Parks—national parks and nature reserves recognized for their outstanding wilderness and biodiversity values—14 of which are located in the Philippines.

Montemayor expressed optimism that ACB's multi-sectoral approach on mainstreaming biodiversity bears a more progressive and greener ASEAN region. (CH/PIA-Laguna)

Imus City, Cavite — More than 500 residents of Imus received free medical, dental, and wellness services during a one-day Medical and Dental Mission held on September 25, 2025, at Narra Homes Subdivision, Pag-asa I.

The activity was spearheaded by the Provincial Government of Cavite in partnership with the Office of the Provincial Health Officer, as part of its continuing effort to expand access to healthcare services, particularly in rural and underserved areas.

A total of 502 individuals availed of general medical consultations, while 10 patients underwent X-rays and 30 patients received electrocardiograms (ECGs). The dental team also provided 33 tooth extractions for residents in need.

Provincial officials emphasized that these outreach programs are vital in bridging gaps in healthcare access, especially for communities that may find it difficult to afford or reach hospital services.

The Provincial Government has been conducting similar missions in various localities across Cavite, reaffirming its commitment to delivering accessible, quality, and responsive healthcare for every Caviteño. /PR

Senate Minority Leader Alan Peter Cayetano on Tuesday said building more community-based health facilities is one way to address the worsening congestion in public hospitals, after the Department of Health (DOH) admitted that hospitals nationwide are operating far beyond capacity.

He is also battling for his Health Centers in All Barangays Act (SB 421), which requires every barangay to establish its own health center within three years, noting that only 26,500 of the country's 42,011 barangays have one, leaving more than 15,000 communities without basic healthcare.

“As the saying goes, prevention is better than cure. Chronic medical conditions can be prevented through accessible healthcare and early detection. This underscores the importance of investing in making primary healthcare accessible, available, and affordable,” he said.

Cayetano pointed to Taguig City's three Super Health Centers, which operate round the clock, as proof that these models are viable.

“Taguig is proof that it works. Kung kaya sa Taguig, we should do it in all our cities and municipalities,” he said.

Both measures are among his top priority bills in the 20th Congress. ###
