

New upgrades, such as LED lighting, energy-efficient inverter appliances, and air-purifying paint, enhance the facility's functionality and sustainability. In addition, the SM DigiKonsulta was introduced, enabling virtual consultations and digital medical record management, in line with PhilHealth's digitalization efforts. The hospital received laptops to support this initiative, making it the first military hospital to adopt SM DigiKonsulta




