

LGUs, Business Leaders Highlight CALAX Subsection 3's Role in Driving Growth



The economic landscape of Cavite is poised for greater growth following the opening of the Cavite-Laguna Expressway (CALAX) Subsection 3, extending the expressway to Governor's Drive Interchange in General Trias City.



With CALAX now spanning 26 kilometers from Mamlasan, Biñan, Laguna to General Trias, Cavite, local government officials and business leaders cited the project's role in improving connectivity, attracting investments, and creating new opportunities for businesses and communities.

Florencio Ayos, President of the GenTri Business Club, said the new subsection is a long-awaited development that cuts travel time between Laguna and Cavite's industrial hubs to just 26 minutes.

"We are no longer a destination that is hard to reach — we are now a city that is impossible to ignore. Infrastructure is not just about roads; it is about opening doors for every Filipino entrepreneur. General Trias is now better positioned than ever to attract investments, generate employment, and build a more resilient economy," Ayos stated.

IV described the new interchange as 'a gateway to greater opportunities' that positions the city as a thriving center of industry. "Habang patuloy na lumalago ang General Trias bilang sentro ng industriya at kaunlaran, mahalaga ang proyektong tulad nito upang mas mailapit ang mga oportunidad sa ating mga kababayan," said Mayor Ferrer.

The positive outlook was echoed by Das-mariñas City Mayor Jennifer Barzaga, who emphasized that the expressway enhances access to commerce, education, and tourism.

"Ang proyektong ito ay hindi lamang tungkol sa bagong kalsada, ito ay tungkol sa mas magandang kalidad ng buhay. Ang CALAX ay simbolo ng patuloy na progreso at ng ating sama-samang pangarap para sa isang mas maunlad, mas konektado, at mas maaliwalas na kinabukasan para sa bawat mamamayan," Mayor Barzaga noted.

Barangay Adlas (Silang) Captain Joelito Generoso highlighted the project's impact on local development. "Napakalaking benepisyo ng pagbubukas ng CALAX Governor's Drive. Nagkaroon ng oportunidad sa negosyo, pagbubukas ng mga bagong trabaho, at pagtaas ng presyo ng lupa. Pinalakas din nito ang turismo at transportasyon ng mga kalakal," Barangay Capt. Generoso said.

Meanwhile, Barangay San Francisco (General Trias) Captain Ryan Santor pointed to the long-term benefits of improved accessibility. "We believe that the opening of CALAX SS3 will bring lasting benefits to nearby communities through improved connectivity, increased investments, and easier transportation of goods and services," said Barangay Capt. Santor.

Beyond improving travel, the opening of CALAX Subsection 3 is expected to strengthen trade, support business expansion, and enhance Cavite's competitiveness as an investment destination.

QUEZON CITY, June 2, 2026 – The Social Security System (SSS) today begins the early rollout of the second tranche of the Pension Reform Program (PRP) to 4.1 million pensioners, advancing the originally scheduled September pension increase to provide SSS pensioners with earlier financial relief.

Finance Secretary and Social Security Commission (SSC) Chair Frederick D. Go and SSS President and Chief Executive Officer Robert Joseph M. de Claro said the agency is releasing approximately P6 billion in additional pension benefits from June to August 2026 to help pensioners cope with inflationary pressures and higher energy costs.

“We are releasing the

second tranche of pension increases ahead of schedule to support millions of pensioners and their families, helping them meet their daily needs and enjoy greater financial security sooner,” Go said.

“With the early implementation, we hope to provide timely relief to our pensioners and their families as they continue to face every day financial challenges,” de Claro said.

He explained that SSS pensioners as of May 31, 2026, will be eligible to receive the pension hike beginning June 1, 2026, while those whose contingencies fall between June 1 and August 31, 2026, will receive their increased pension starting September 1, 2026.

Under the second

tranche of the PRP, retirement and disability pensioners will receive a 10% increase in their monthly pensions, while death and survivor pensioners will receive a 5% increase.

“We recognize that rising prices and economic uncertainty continue to place pressure on Filipino families and businesses,” de Claro added. “Through the PRP, SSS ensures that our pensioners have access to timely, affordable and reliable financial support when they need it most.”

The PRP is the first-ever multi-year pension increase in SSS history. Under the program, pensioners will receive annual increases in their pensions every September from 2025 to 2027. #

Two executives of CARD Mutually Reinforcing Institutions (CARD MRI), Dr. Edzel A. Ramos and Mr. Frederick Nicasio M. Torres, were recognized during the Gawad Ng Namumukod Tanging San Pableño 2026 held at the San Pablo City Convention Center on May 7 for their leadership and contributions to community development through the institutions they serve.

The award honors individuals from San Pablo City whose service and leadership have made meaningful contributions to community development. It also recognizes those who serve as leaders in their respective fields through their advocacy and achievements.

Transformative Education

Dr. Edzel A. Ramos, President of CARD-MRI Development Institute (CMDI) Inc., the learning and training institute of CARD MRI that offers tertiary education, senior high school programs, and capacity-building programs, was recognized as Namumukod Tanging San Pableño for Transformative Education. This category recognizes individuals who promote quality and accessible education through meaningful programs, initiatives, and partnerships.

Dr. Ramos is one of the key individuals behind CMDI's growth from a training unit established in 2000 into an academic institution dedicated to providing quality education to socio-economically challenged families. He began his journey with CARD MRI in 1996 as a Technical Officer of CARD, Inc. (A Microfinance NGO), where he worked closely with communities and witnessed firsthand the struggles of underserved families. These experiences strengthened his commitment to education and people development.

As CARD MRI expanded its training initiatives, Dr. Ramos transitioned into training and development roles, focusing on empowering individuals through education. When CMDI formally became a training institution in 2005, he served as its Training Director. He helped lead programs that trained more than 300 employees to teach financial education to students and community members.

Since its formal establishment, CMDI has strengthened its community-focused education and expanded its training programs. In 2013, the institution introduced the Microfinance Technology NC II program under the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) and later became an accredited assessment center for the course. In 2015, CMDI received approval

from the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) to operate as a tertiary education institution. In 2024, Dr. Ramos became the school's president, leading it to begin offering senior high school programs.

Today, CMDI remains committed to producing competent and values-driven learners who contribute to community development and social transformation. It now has four campuses in San Pablo City and Bay, Laguna; Tagum City, Davao del Norte; and Buenavista, Agusan del Norte, focusing on providing practical and values-driven education.

“We have always believed that education is a powerful tool in shaping the future of the youth. I am truly honored and at the same time grateful to be part of CMDI's journey,” said Dr. Ramos as he reflected on CMDI's growth in expanding its educational service and in his years of service in CARD MRI.

“This recognition inspires us to continue reaching more students, employees, and communities with limited access to quality education. We will continue creating learning opportunities, honing skills, and helping individuals build a better future for themselves and their families,” he said.

Social Entrepreneurship

The local government of San Pablo also recognized Mr. Frederick Nicasio M. Torres as Namumukod Tanging San Pableño for Social Entrepreneurship. The award honors individuals who build enterprises that open livelihood opportunities and support inclusive growth within communities.

Torres currently leads different enterprise development and business support institutions under CARD MRI. He serves as Chairman of Mga Likha ni Inay, CARD-Business Development Services Foundation Inc. (CARD-BDSFI), and CARD Leasing and Finance Corporation (CARD LFC). He is also the Executive Vice President of CARD Indogrosir and Ottokonek.

Beforehand, he started his career in CARD MRI as a management trainee in its financial institutions, particularly at CARD, Inc. and CARD SME Bank, a thrift bank focused on providing financial services to small- and medium-sized entrepreneurs. Over the years, he took on leadership positions, including deputy director for operations and regional director, and this deepened his understanding of the challenges faced by marginalized sectors and the importance of creating opportunities for them to build and sustain their own businesses.

In 2013, Torres helped establish CARD Leasing and Finance Corporation (CARD LFC) to further expand support services for clients through leasing, business assistance, and housing finance programs.

Under his leadership, CARD-BDSFI has helped bridge microentrepreneur clients to the mainstream market by promoting local products and supporting their growth. This effort later paved the way for the establishment of Mga Likha ni Inay (MLNI), which transforms locally sourced products from rural microentrepreneurs into marketable, locally inspired goods.

Meanwhile, CARD Indogrosir and Ottokonek, established in partnership with Indonesia's Salim Group, continue to strengthen community enterprises by wholesaling and retailing grocery goods at distributor prices. These also support clients and customers operating mobile stores, carts, and sari-sari stores in their communities.

Through these institutions, Torres has helped CARD MRI in strengthening access to markets and support systems for microentrepreneurs, especially in rural and marginalized communities.

“This recognition is for the Nanays who we are able to uplift through our mission at CARD MRI. Entrepreneurship becomes most meaningful when it creates opportunity and hope for communities. When we empower microenterprises to thrive, we prove that businesses can be both sustainable and compassionate. Real progress happens when growth is shared, and when every success story opens doors for others to rise with us,” said Torres, reflecting on how CARD MRI shaped his advocacy for inclusive enterprise development.

Behind the Impact

At the core of Dr. Ramos and Torres' leadership in education and enterprise development is CARD MRI's shared mission to uplift underserved communities and help eradicate poverty.

Their recognition as Namumukod Tanging San Pableños reflects the impact of their work in education and enterprise development, as well as their commitment to building stronger, more inclusive communities.

55 INDIVIDUALS RESCUED FROM ALLEGED ILLEGAL RECRUITMENT OPERATION IN IMUS



IMUS, Cavite — More than 55 individuals were rescued during an operation conducted by the Department of Migrant Workers (DMW), in coordination with the Imus Police and the City Government of Imus, on June 6 in Barangay Medicion 2-A.

The operation was launched following reports regarding the use of an unaccredited facility that allegedly housed individuals recruited for overseas employment, despite the recruitment agency reportedly holding accreditation.

Authorities rescued 37 individuals from one residence and another 18 from a separate house. According to initial findings, the victims' passports had been confiscated, while some had reportedly been staying in the facilities for more than a year under questionable conditions.

The rescue operation was personally led by DMW Secretary Hans Leo Cacdac, together with Assistant Secretary Jerome A. Alcantara and Regional Director Atty. April Casabuena. The City Government of Imus, through the Public Employment Service Office headed by Officer-in-Charge Cecile Foz, provided assistance during the operation.

Also supporting the activity were officials from Barangay Medicion 2-A and Medicion 2nd, the Office of the City Social Welfare and Development Officer, Civil Security Unit, Office of the Business Permits and Licensing Officer, and the Office of the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Officer.

Following the rescue, the affected individuals were temporarily transferred to shelters managed by the DMW and the Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA), where they are receiving assistance and support while authorities continue their investigation.

Government officials emphasized the importance of verifying the legitimacy of recruitment agencies and employment opportunities before accepting overseas job offers. Authorities are currently identifying those responsible for operating the facilities and are preparing appropriate charges against individuals found to be involved in illegal recruitment activities.

The successful operation underscores the government's continuing efforts to protect overseas job seekers from exploitation and to safeguard the welfare of Filipino workers.

CAVITE CAREER CARAVAN BRINGS JOBS AND SERVICES TO NOVELETA



NOVELETA, Cavite — The Cavite Career Caravan successfully connected job seekers with employment opportunities during its conduct on June 4 at the Noveleta Town Plaza.

The activity was organized through the joint efforts of the Office of the Provincial Public Employment Service Manager (OPPESM), headed by Ms. Rizalie Pinpin-Enero, and the Municipal Government of Noveleta under the leadership of Mayor Davey Reyes-Chua.

A total of 132 applicants registered and participated in the caravan, with 22 individuals hired on the spot, providing immediate employment opportunities for local residents.

To further assist applicants, eight national government agencies also took part in the caravan, namely the Social Security System (SSS), PhilHealth, Pag-IBIG Fund, Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR), Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA), and the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA). These agencies provided information, consultations, and services related to employment requirements, skills development, and career opportunities.

Mayor Davey Reyes-Chua, together with the Noveleta Public Employment Service Office (PESO), encouraged residents to take advantage of the opportunities offered by the caravan. To reach more potential applicants, the mayor also conducted a live online broadcast promoting the event and inviting job seekers to participate.

The Career Caravan forms part of the Provincial Government of Cavite's continuing efforts to bring employment opportunities and government services closer to communities while helping residents secure jobs and improve their livelihoods.

Senate President Alan Peter Cayetano has instructed Senate Secretary Atty. Jose Luis Montales to ensure that the impeachment trial calendar proceeds unimpeded.

In a letter dated June 7, 2026, Cayetano directed Montales to initiate discussions with Atty. Renato N. Bantug Jr., the Gatchalian bloc's purported Senate Secretary, for possible interim administrative arrangements that would allow the Senate Impeachment Court to continue functioning without delay.

Under the approved calendar, the impeachment court is scheduled to issue the Notice of Pre-Trial tomorrow, June 9, signalling the start of the pre-trial proceedings.

Cayetano said that while he maintains the June 3 reorganization was illegal in a “substantial and unmistakable” way, the controversy should not be allowed to paralyze the Senate, disrupt public service, or delay the impeachment proceedings.

“Pending resolution [by the Supreme Court], it is imperative that the resulting legal and political dispute not be allowed to unnecessarily disrupt the operations of the Senate, impair the work of the Impeachment Court, or diminish the institution's ability to discharge its constitutional responsibilities,” he emphasized.

Complying with the Senate President's directive, Montales wrote Bantug on June 8 to request a meeting “to discuss a possible way forward that may preserve

the continuity of institutional operations and allow the impeachment proceedings to move forward in an orderly manner.”

One possible interim arrangement raised in the letters is a dual-signatory or joint-certification mechanism for vouchers, checks, disbursements, contracts, personnel actions, and other documents necessary for the continued operations of the Senate and the Impeachment Court.

Under the proposed mechanism, documents requiring approval or certification may, where practicable, bear the signatures of the officials presently exercising the relevant functions and those asserting authority to perform the same functions.

Cayetano made clear that the proposed mechanism will be issued “solely as a practical and institutional measure” in order to ensure continuity of the Senate's Constitutional duty during an “extraordinary situation.”

He added that possible interim arrangements must protect Senate employees from being placed in an “untenable position.”

“They should not be subjected to pressure arising from matters beyond their duties and competence to determine. Public servants who have faithfully served this institution for many years should not become collateral casualties or unwilling instruments in a legal and political conflict not of their making,” he said.###

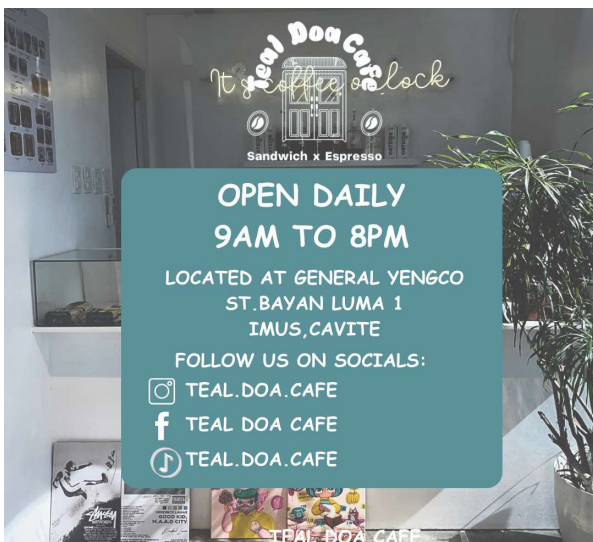
